Five people were rescued from the Missouri River near Yankton Tuesday night, according to law enforcement dispatches.

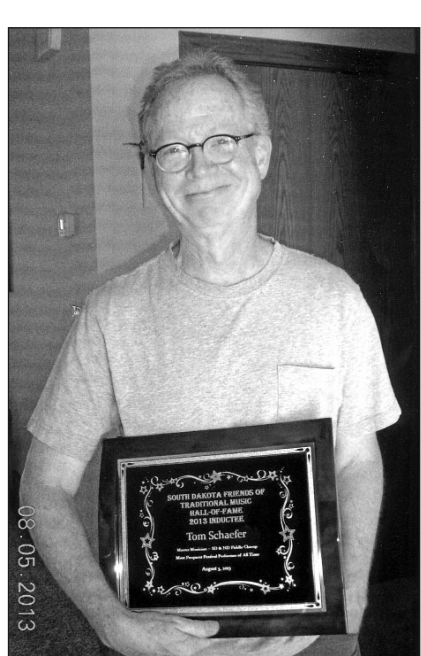
Reports were received of individuals who were drifting in the water and struggling to get out. Emergency crews from Yankton and from Cedar County were summoned for search efforts.

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures were lower Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery fell 7.50 cents to \$6.46 a bushel; December corn fell 10 cents to \$4.7550 a bushel; December oats were 2 cents lower at \$3.3425 a bushel; while November soybeans declined 12.75 cents to \$12.9050 a bushel.

Beef and pork prices were higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

October live cattle rose .8 cent to \$1.2815 a pound; September feeder cattle rose .30 cent to \$1.5825 a pound; while October lean hogs were .48 cent higher at \$8.695 a pound.

high-risk group (elderly, pregnant, people with high blood pressure and diabetes), they should consider not even going out at night."

So far, the disease has been reported in 22 counties across South Dakota with Brown County reporting the most human cases (12). The northeastern part of the state has seen the majority of the cases reported.

Yankton County has yet to report a case.
