



One of the goals, we always say, is not to make the formula less confusing, but to make it more predictable,' Griffith said. "I have no idea" how my microwave works ... but it's predictable. I put my coffee in there, wait 30 seconds, and it always heats it."

At stake in the formula is nearly \$1 billion per year in "equalization aid" from the state, which helps public school districts fill the gap between their needs and what they can cover through local property-tax revenue.

School funding is the single largest budget item that lawmakers have debated in recent years.

The formula also gives more money to districts that maintain longer school years and employ more highly educated teachers.

The work session on Wednesday was part of a broader legislative study of the formula. A group of lawmakers will travel around the state next month to gather public input from teachers, parents, and other stakeholders.


