COMMISSION MEETING  
August 23, 2013**

A special meeting of the Yankton County Board of Commissioners was called to order by Chairman Bruce Jensen at 1:30 p.m. on Friday, August 23, 2013 in the Commission Chamber at the County Government Center. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Roll call was taken with the following members present: Bruce Jensen, Donna Freng, Mark Johnson, Garry Moore and Allen Sinclair.

Also present at the start of the meeting were the following county officials: Auditor Patty Hojem (clerk), Register of Deeds Brian Hunhoff (recorder), Emergency Management Director Paul Scherschligt and Emergency Medical Services Administrator Steve Hawkins.

**Bids for EM Services Station #2:** The Board discussed two bids received July 16 for construction of Emergency Services Station #2 - a vehicle storage building planned for the west side of the county ambulance facility at 805 Capital Street. Welfl Construction of Yankton bid \$138,700. James Steel Erection of Yankton bid \$122,625. The Board and Auditor Hojem discussed steps that need to be taken to proceed with the project. Commissioner Moore questioned the scope of the project, which began as a \$50,000 cold storage building. Scherschligt said some of the increased costs were the result of unanticipated city requirements for landscaping the project area.

**Action13418OHSEM:** A motion was made by Sinclair and seconded by Johnson to transfer \$100,270 from the General Fund to the Emergency Management Budget. Voting aye: Sinclair, Johnson, Freng, Jensen. Voting no: Moore. Motion carried 4-1.

**Action 13419OHSEM:** A motion was made by Freng and seconded by Johnson to advertise a budget supplement hearing in September to supplement the Emergency Management budget by \$122,625 to pay for a new vehicle storage building. Voting aye: Freng, Johnson, Sinclair, Jensen. Voting no: Moore. Motion carried 4-1.

**Government Center Water Problem:** Representatives of the Contact Center and Treasurer's Office expressed concerns to the Board about water leaks in the Government Center. Treasurer Marchand said her office has had ongoing issues with window leaks in her first floor office. Welfare Director Adamson said a water leak in her basement office was recently discovered behind a file cabinet where mold was growing on the carpet, sheetrock and insulation. Other offices in the basement have also had water issues. Commissioner Freng and Maintenance Manager Wagner said they believe the basement skylights are the source of the leaks. The Board discussed hiring a contractor to remove the skylights and evaluate seals on other windows in the building. In the meantime, commissioners agreed to move Contact Center staff members to other office space in the building until the area with mold can be cleaned, dried out and repaired.

**Funding Request:** The Board reviewed a funding request from the Yankton Girls Softball Association. Commissioners agreed to take no action at this time, but will reconsider the request at the end of the year when more is known about the County's financial status for 2014.

**Gap Policy:** Daisy Kamback and Jennifer Genant of AFLAC were present to explain a new hospital confinement gap policy available for county employees.

**Easement Request:** Jeff Koster discussed a 15-acre parcel he owns in Deep Woods Subdivision that is landlocked and cannot be accessed by vehicle. The previous owner gained access to the property by walking across land owned by a neighbor, with permission. Koster said he needs vehicle access to the property and his attorney advised him to bring the matter before the County Commission. Commissioner Moore cited South Dakota Codified Law 31-22-1, which requires landowners to allow an access easement to adjacent properties landlocked from direct access to a public road. The Board advised Koster to further discuss the issue with his attorney and States Attorney Rob Klimisch to determine steps that must be taken, pursuant to the statute.

**Bi-Weekly Highway Report:** Highway Superintendent Gustad reported his department has spent about half of the \$65,000 budgeted this year for application of magnesium chloride to gravel roads with washboard issues. Commissioners directed Gustad to give priority to roads with the highest traffic counts or safety issues. Gustad will prepare a report for the Board listing roads he is recommending for magnesium chloride treatments. Gustad said the Stone Church Road Project is about 60 percent complete. He said chip seal projects for 2013 are completed.

**Pavement Marking Request:** The Board and Gustad reviewed a cost-share proposal from the City of Yankton for permanent pavement marking on the reconstructed Bill Baggs Road from Highway 50 to Alumax Road. The \$52,019.30 project cost would be split with the City paying 60 percent and the County paying 40 percent. Commissioners agreed the cost of the project was high for the work being proposed.
