Jacks Hungry For More After First Playoff Win

Nine wins. Four losses. The record a year ago for the South Dakota State football team, though a 4-win jump from the previous season, was impressive, but the Jackrabbits are far from con-

If only there was a word to describe that fine line, head coach John Stiegelmeier joked.

"I go from thinking we can win every football game to times where I don't even think we're close to our potential," he said. "I feel good that we're going to be prepared."

Outsiders also feel good about where the Jackrabbits are as the 2013 season begins Aug. 31 at home against Butler. SDSU was tabbed No. 6 in the FCS media poll and No. 7 by the coaches — the two most notable polls.

Still, the Jacks can't afford to relish those predictions, according to junior offensive lineman Trevor Greger.

"I know that we were picked in the top ten, but to me, that we're still picked to lose a couple games," Greger, a former Wagner standout, said. "We're focusing on going 1 and 0 every week.

'We can't focus too far ahead," he added. "If we set our minds on the second or third game, it takes all your attention away from the first

As the program has improved from back-to-back 5-6 seasons in 2010 and 2011, it has tried to look at "objective measures," Stiegelmeier said.

"Stats never tell you that, and wins and losses may not either," Stiegelmeier said. "At the end of the season, were we one of the teams in the playoff picture? Are we sneaking in?

The goal, the target is to be one of the top eight seeds," he added. "That's how we try to quantify moving in the right direction."

To continue that ascent, the Jacks will turn to 15 returning starters, with the biggest group coming on both lines.

SDSU brings back four of five offensive linemen (Greger, All-American Bryan Witzmann, Alex Parker and Taylor Suess), as well as quarterback Austin Sumner, tight end Vince Benedetto, receiver Brandon Hubert and All-American running back Zach Zenner.

Defensively, the Jacks are again strong on the line, with Doug Peete, David Hettiger and Marshall Peugh back. T.J. Lally returns at linebacker, while cornerbacks Winston Wright and Je Ryan Butler are back in the secondary.

"In my mind, each of us has a challenge to get better every day," Stiegelmeier said. "Experience means your improvements are that much better. You ask, 'How do I become a better player?'


