Family Ties

The second-round lead in the team rankings was held by the McFate family of Muscatine, Iowa.

The tournament has been a family tradition for the McFates, ever since father Pat was first invited to the tournament by Tom Hendricks back in 1984. Since then, sons Dan and Darrin have joined him, Dan for 17 years and Darrin for 11.

The atmosphere has played a big part in keeping the McFate family coming back to Yankton each year.

"It's Yankton," Pat said. "It's very friendly here."

Dan also had great things to say about how the family has been treated at the event.

"It kinda feels like you're a pro. They treat you well, say your name before you tee off," he said. "This is the one week I look forward to the most."

While the McFates have been coming to Hillcrest for years, this was the first time they played the tournament together. The chance to do so could not be passed up.

"It was a very easy choice," Pat said. "Back in Muscatine we very rarely play together."

Through two rounds, the family-team has worked pretty well. The family has an eight-stroke lead entering today's final round of team competition.

"We're playing well as a team," Darrin said.

"Nobody's beat anybody up yet."

"But there's still one more day."

Besides the McFates, five other golfers hail from Muscatine, Iowa, including another complete group: Sam and Jon Nietzel and Diaan Roos. Doug Roelle, Lucas Jordan and Troy Payne also call Muscatine home, tying it for third among hometowns represented in the tournament behind Yankton and Sioux Falls. Lincoln, Nebraska, also has nine representatives, including one pro.

Scottsdale, Arizona is the most popular hometown among pros, with three in the proam field.

Fox Run Champ

Andre Metzger of Sioux Falls has twice come into the Hillcrest Pro-Am after winning the pro title at the Thivert Financial Charity Pro-Am at Fox Run the previous weekend. He feels that can work both for him and against him.

"You know that, at that time, you're the best golfer in the field. It helps with the confidence," Metzger said after Friday's second round. "At the same time, you put a lot into one tournament, experience success, and you have to get back to the grind like you haven't won anything in the next one."

One thing Metzger does appreciate is the opportunity to spend 10 days in the same place, something that does not happen anywhere else on the Dakotas Tour.

"I definitely feel comfortable here, more than most places," he said. "Here you get to hang out for a week and a half. You don't strictly grind on golf."
