Mitchell Tops Watertown 11-7 For AA Majors Title

For Mitchell head coach Dustin Wheeler, the toughest thing this season has likely been the coin toss. But his Black squad has even turned that into a positive.

Mitchell jumped out to an early 6-0 lead, then iced the victory with a four-run sixth in an 11-7 victory over the Watertown Black Sox in the championship of the South Dakota State VFW Teener Class AA 13-14 Majors baseball tournament, which concluded on Sunday at Yankton's Riverside Field.

"Our joke all season has been about the trouble we've had with the coin toss," Wheeler said after the victory. "But we've almost embraced it. It gives us a chance to score first and put the other team in a hole. It's a lot harder for a guy to pitch when his team is down.

Mitchell jumped on Watertown starter Brandon Florey early, pounding out three hits and taking advantage of two walks in a five-run first inning. Carson Max doubled, and Carter Max and Baley Miller had run-scoring hits in the frame.

Mitchell racked up three more singles, including a run-plating shot by Drew Kitchens, to stretch the lead to 6-0 after two innings. But Watertown batted around in the bottom of the third, with RBI singles by Brayden Schriver and Max Sonne providing the key blows, to cut the margin to 6-4.

"When we get down, we never stop," said Watertown head coach Blake Hult. "We kept a positive atti-

tude the entire weekend. Hult, who won a Class AA Minors title for Watertown in Yankton in 2009, said that the momentum from Saturday's come-from-behind victory over Pierre that sent the Black Sox to Sunday helped keep them going.

"Last night's comeback was huge for us," he said. "We brought a lot of momentum and confidence going in to today."


