

City Budget To Be Pitched Tonight

Yankton city leaders will meet tonight (Tuesday) to work on the city's proposed 2015 budget.

Under the proposed 2015 budget, the city would spend \$52,786,507 while bringing in \$61,361,443 in revenue.

Among the items to be discussed are:

- Sales tax revenue which is projected to see 2 percent growth over the next year.
 - Recommendations for increases in rates for water, wastewater and solid waste funds.
 - Various equipment purchases, which will include a ladder truck for the fire department, a motor grader and a new K-9 unit.
 - Enhancing marketing of the Fox Run Golf Course.
 - Cost for personnel insurance under the Affordable Care Act.
 - Completing road projects including Douglas Ave. to Wilson Rd., and Wilson Rd. to Highway 81.
 - Construction of a collector well at Paddlewheel Point.
 - Revamping the city's website with a modern interface as well as options to pay utility bills from the city's website.
- The meeting is slated to start at 5:30 p.m. on the second floor of city hall. There is a possibility it will be continued on Wednesday night, as well.

Parkston To Be SD's Capital For A Day

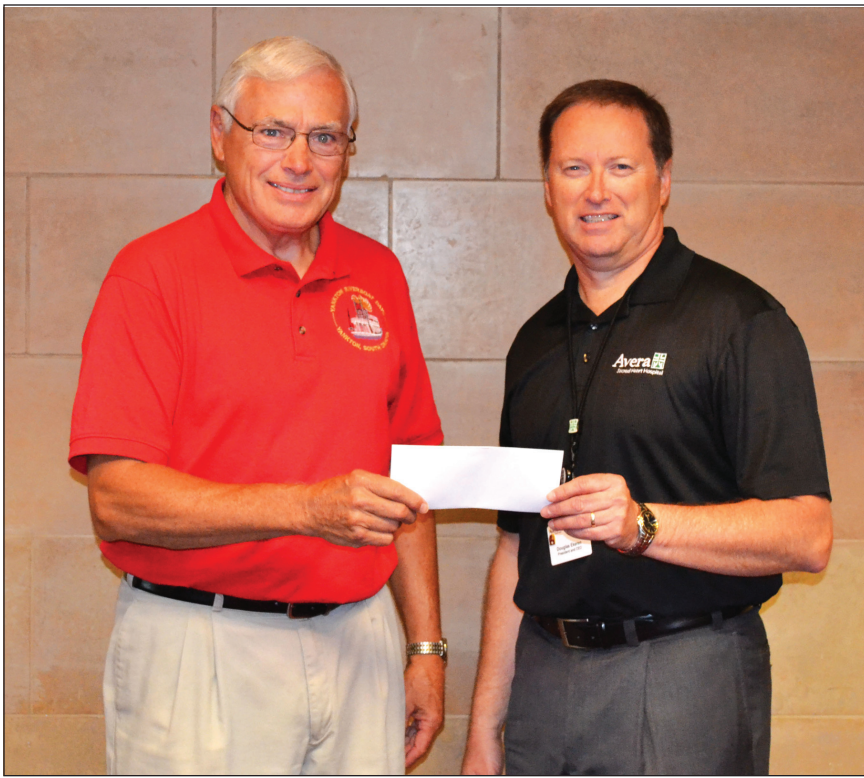
PIERRE (AP) — The city of Parkston will be South Dakota's capital on Aug. 27.

CHARLESTON, W.V. — Jacob Reeves of Avon High School from Avon represented South Dakota as a delegate recently to the 2014 National Youth Science Camp® (NYSC).

Reeves joined 100 other top high school graduates representing the United States and eight other countries at the prestigious four-week program, now in its 51st year. The NYSC, located in the beautiful and rustic setting of the Monongahela National Forest in West Virginia, integrates scientific programming with opportunities for delegates to explore music, art and the outdoors.

Each year, delegates are able to attend lectures and directed studies led by top scientists and professors from all over the country. This year's lecture topics included: cancer research, genomic medicine, radio astronomy and energy sustainability. Throughout camp, the directed study program allowed delegates to have extensive hands-on experience in specific fields that interest the delegates individually. Delegates had the opportunity to dissect a human brain, discuss

bioethics, construct robots and study cybersecurity measures.

In addition to learning about groundbreaking scientific research, delegates explored their natural surroundings through an extensive outdoor program consisting of hiking, caving, mountain biking and rock climbing. The overnight backpacking trips provided delegates an opportunity to bond and appreciate the simplicity of nature. Delegates also chose from seminars ranging from Ultimate Frisbee and swing dancing to discussions of philosophy, travel, religion and culture.

Reeves said, "[National Youth Science Camp] has shown me to keep my mind open at all times."

Reeves also included, "[National Youth Science Camp] gathers some of the brightest and most ambitious students in the nation together, where we all help each other to learn and achieve."

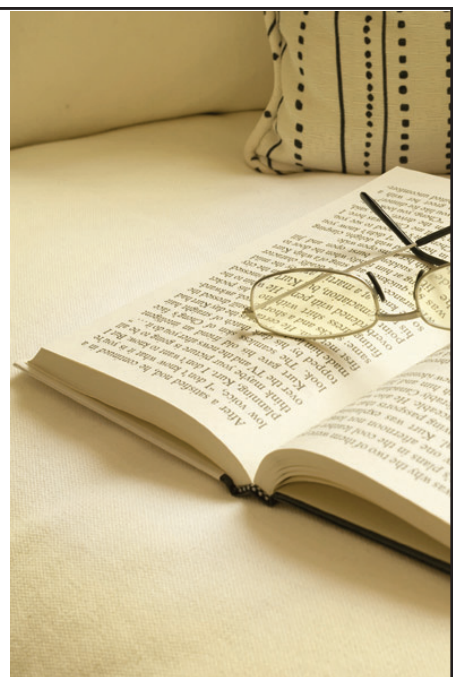
