the IFAA World Indoor Championships, said she enjoys her time in Yankton — even if it takes nearly two days to eventually arrive in Yankton.

"It's a neat experience to shoot here," she said.

Zietsman said she got to Yankton last Thursday night, well in advance of Sunday night's opening ceremonies — "to get rested up," she said.

Knaack understands that idea.

The veteran archer from Switzerland needed 30 hours to travel from his home to Yankton, which including an 8-hour layover in a Chicago airport.

He had previously been to Yankton in 2011 for an IFAA instructor training course, which gave him some kind of perspective for this year's tournament.

"So at least I knew the area a little bit," Knaack said.

His impression of the updates since he was last at Yankton's archery complex? "They spent a lot of money out here," he said.

While some archers might see Yankton being a host as an inconvenience, given its location at least an hour from an airport, Knaack didn't see it as a problem.

"In Europe, there aren't as many airports as you'd think," he said. "Everything is public transportation."

When he stayed overnight in Sioux Falls after arriving last week, Knaack said people he met weren't aware of the state's archery impact.

In Yankton, though, it's been a different story, Knaack said.

"The people here are friendly and very interested in it (archery)," he said. "They know about the tournament; know what's going on."

The World Field Championships continue today (Tuesday) and conclude Friday.

English Supporter

"Most of this wasn't here last time," Murray said, looking around the new plaza area, with a comfort station, picnic tables and bow racks.

Since Murray's previous visit, the NFAA has also built an extension to its main facility, which now boasts one of the world's only 90-meter indoor range.

"We have a place like this back home, but nothing this big," Murray said.

Murray and his group have yet to venture out to the rest of Yankton
