or something for everybody to get all emotional about when we should be getting out in front of this and taking a good, hard look," he said. "We've got a great opportunity here to do a 20-year plan and we're opening up the doors so much for everybody to have an input."

Another obstacle the county faces in the creation and implementation of a 20year plan is a nearly-40 year old county resolution barring Yankton County from taking on any new roads. This was done in part because of the growing number of subdivisions in the county. Since then, many more new subdivisions have popped up, especially in the Lewis & Clark Lake area, where road maintenance and construction is the responsibility of the residents living along them.

County Commission chairman Bruce Jensen said the 1976 resolution isn't conducive to the growth of the county.

"(It) needs to change because a lot has happened in 30, 40 years," Jensen said. "It's too restrictive. I'm not condemning (the previous Commission), they did what they thought was right. But everything changes."
