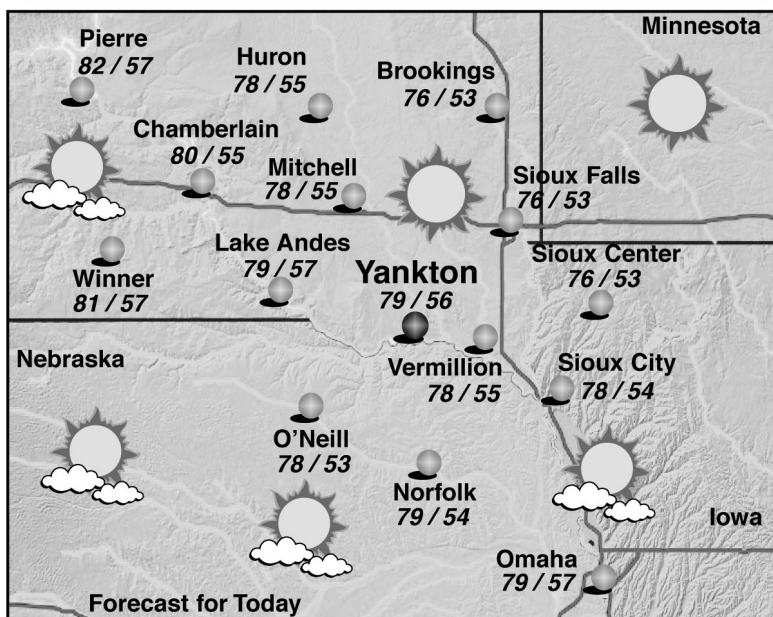

or something for everybody to get all emotional about when we should be getting out in front of this and taking a good, hard look," he said. "We've got a great opportunity here to do a 20-year plan and we're opening up the doors so much for everybody to have an input."

Another obstacle the county faces in the creation and implementation of a 20-year plan is a nearly-40 year old county resolution barring Yankton County from taking on any new roads. This was done in part because of the growing number of subdivisions in the county. Since then, many more new subdivisions have popped up, especially in the Lewis & Clark Lake area, where road maintenance and construction is the responsibility of the residents living along them.

County Commission chairman Bruce Jensen said the 1976 resolution isn't conducive to the growth of the county.

"(It) needs to change because a lot has happened in 30, 40 years," Jensen said. "It's too restrictive. I'm not condemning (the previous Commission), they did what they thought was right. But everything changes."

The resolution arose during last week's commission meeting when residents along 310th St. sought to have the county come in and lay down gravel on the road. The county turned the proposal down due to the 1976 resolution, since 310th St. is not a county road.

While Jensen expects the commission to go through the process to strike the resolution down, he pointed out there will still be standards by which the county takes on new roads.

"We'll be selective — we're not just going to build roads all over," he said. "We'll pick the criteria of where we should put roads (based on) the traffic, safety and how many people live there."

Garrity said there's a number of projects the 20-year plan will look at, including interconnecting bike trails that link the county's communities; priority lanes for trucks getting in and out of Lesterfield, Utica, Mission Hill and Volin; and how to get pedestrians safely across Highway 52 and a railroad crossing in Utica.

The next public meeting is scheduled to take place sometime in either late September or early October. A firm date will be released later.

books, transportation and personal costs.

"We really feel strongly about students not getting hit over the head with debt," Kocer said. "If a student just goes off and takes another set of loans outside of school that we don't even know about, it is really hard to counsel them about their loan debt and what their repayment plan will be."

During Kocer's testimony, he recommended school certification for all private loans. By involving the education institutions in the process, it would allow schools to track the students' borrowing so that the school could help counsel the students on their overall loan debt.

"We consider this a good practice as it provides us with more information to assist in preventing students from over-borrowing."

Kocer also recommended that Congress should mandate the creation of a single web portal where students can access information about all of their student loans in one place.

"Students need an accessible 'one-stop shop' where they

can manage their student loans. Many borrowers have multiple loans with different loan holders that may be in various stages of repayment," said Kocer during his testimony. "Having a central website where borrowers could access information about all of their loans would significantly help students as they manage their borrowing and repayment."

The National Student Loan Debt System (NSLDS) partially serves this to students because it only includes some federal student loans in its system. Expanding this data would largely benefit students by having everything in one place.

Looking back on the testimony, Kocer said he felt that he delivered some good information right to the source.

"This was an excellent opportunity to express views not only for Mount Marty but the state of South Dakota," he said.
