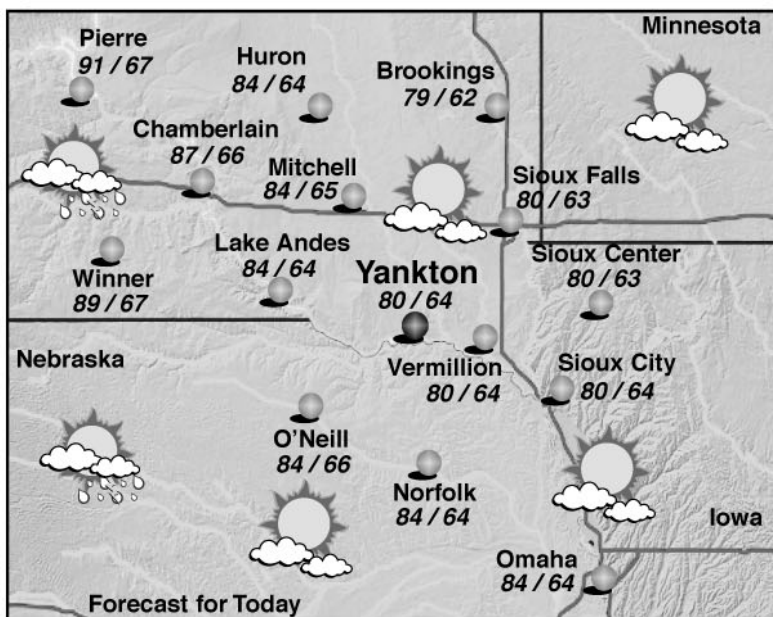

clerk, Mechaley maintained possession of the checkbook utilized by the village and was the bookkeeper on the account. She also had signature authority on the account.

Beginning in March 2010 and continuing through June 2012, Mechaley wrote unauthorized checks to herself to-

taling \$16,726.22. Although the Village of Santee required two signatures on all checks, Mechaley signed the checks in her capacity as village clerk and also forged the signature of the village board's chairman.

The theft of funds was discovered by the village board's vice president when he gathered bank statements and canceled checks to provide information for a grant awarded to the Village of Santee.

The FBI investigated this case.

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly lower Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for Sept delivery fell 10 cents to \$5.28 a bushel; Dec corn was .75 cent higher at 3.6975 a bushel; Dec oats were 1 cent lower at \$3.3150 a bushel; while Nov soybeans fell 12.75 cents to \$10.4675 a bushel.

WALL ST. RECAP

A modest gain for the stock market on Wednesday tugged the Dow Jones industrial average back into the black for the year as investors set aside concerns about Ukraine, Iraq and earnings, at least for a day. Amazon led the gains in light trading, despite a mixed batch of economic and corporate news.

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 91.26 points, or 0.6 percent, to 16,651.80.

The Standard & Poor's 500 index rose 12.97 points, or 0.7 percent, to end at 1,946.72.

The Nasdaq composite rose 44.87 points, or 1 percent, to 4,434.13.
