# Several Area Roads Set To Be Chip Sealed Starting Aug. 19

The City of Yankton Street Department will begin the street seal coat program the week of Aug. 19 and should be completed in approximately one week, weather permitting.

Streets scheduled for sealing include the following:

- Peninah Street — East 8th Street to Whiting Drive
- Birch Road — East 8th Street to Peninah Street
- East 18th Street — Peninah Street to Burleigh Street
- Valley Drive — Cul-de-sac
- Golf Lane — Mulberry Street to Western Avenue
- Western Avenue — Golf Lane to East 23rd Street

- Lakeview Drive — East 29th Street to Mary Street
- Mary Street — Lakeview Drive to East 31st Street
- Francis Street — Lakeview Drive to East 31st Street
- West Street — West 8th Street to Water Tower
- West Street — West 12th Street to North End
- West 12th Street — West Street to Redmond Street
- Dakota Street — West 11th Street to West 12th Street
- West 10th Street — Jackson Street to Summit Street
- Augusta Circle — Fox Run Parkway

- Anchor Drive — Cul-de-sac
- Adkins Drive — Highway 50 to Mulligan Drive
- Pasque Court — Cul-de-sac
- Pasque Circle — Adkins Drive to Adkins Drive
- Mulligan Drive — Adkins Drive to Abbott Drive
- Alley — Riverside Drive to West 4th Street/Green Street to Locust Street

The process will be to oil the road and cover it with 3/8-inch rock chips. The streets will be closed to traffic during the seal coat process and opened to traffic immediately after the application.

After one week, the street sweeper will pick up the excess chips that are still loose.

"No Parking" signs will be placed on the streets the day before they are sealed. Please observe these signs and do not park on the streets until the work is done. Do not blow grass onto the street before the streets are sealed or permit underground irrigation systems to run water onto the streets while the No Parking signs are up. In the event of rain, the process may be postponed.

## WALL ST. RECAP

Better corporate earnings helped nudge the stock market higher on Thursday in one of the quietest sessions this year. Healthcare companies led the major indexes to slight gains, while Berkshire Hathaway crossed another milestone, trading above \$200,000 a share for the first time.

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 61.78 points, or 0.4 percent, to 16,713.58.

The Standard & Poor's 500 index rose 8.46 points, or 0.4 percent, to close at 1,955.18.

The Nasdaq composite rose 18.88 points, or 0.4 percent, to 4,453.00.

The S&P 500 is up 23.59 points, or 1.2 percent.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were higher on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for Sept delivery rose 9.25 cents to \$5.3725 a bushel; Dec corn was 3.75 cents higher at \$3.7350 a bushel; Dec oats were 1.75 cents higher at \$3.3325 a bushel; while Nov soybeans advanced 9.25 cents to \$10.56 a bushel.

Beef was mixed and pork was lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

Oct live cattle rose .80 cent to \$14.735 a pound; Sep feeder cattle was .50 cent lower at \$2.1305 a pound; while Oct lean hogs fell 2.15 cents to \$.9525 a pound.

- Reports which have gained prevalence that bridge tolls on passenger cars and small farm trucks are to be raised, effective Sept. 1, are in error, according to the revised schedule of tolls prepared by the Meridian Highway Bridge company, which is to be published on Thursday of this week.
- The agricultural conservation office here reported today that work was started yesterday sealing the 1939 wheat crop of Yankton county, the grain being sealed on loan of from 65 to 75 cents per bushel, depending on the grade of the wheat.

- Three young Canadians stopped here today on their way from Calgary, Alta., Can., to New Orleans, La., by canoe. They reached Gavins Point dam in their 16-foot fiberglass canoe at about 6:30 p.m. Friday.
