ASIST Training To Be Held In Yankton

The Helpline Center in Sioux Falls is offering training to help people working and interacting with those at risk for suicide. The Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) will be held Sept. 18-19 at the South Dakota Human Services Center's South training center in Yankton.

This two-day training is designed to provide a practical face-to-face intervention model for caregivers to use when encountering a person at risk of suicide.

ASIST participants will improve their ability to be a ready, willing and able caregiver by talking openly, honestly and directly with those at risk of suicide.

There is no cost for the training, and registration is limited to 30 participants. Applications will be made for CEU's for Social Work, Counseling, and Drug & Alcohol Professionals.

SHERIFF'S REPORT

KNOX CO. SHERIFF'S REPORT

On Aug. 2, 2014, the Knox County Sheriff's Office received a report of a one vehicle accident on 512 Ave. just north of 874th Rd. Ashley Oswald was traveling north and was met by an unknown vehicle traveling south on the wrong side of the road. Oswald's vehicle was forced off the road and struck a barbed wire fence and a utility pole. NCPD arrived and replaced the electric service line. Oswald reported no injuries and no additional departments were called. Oswald's vehicle was damaged but she was able to drive it away from the scene of the accident. At this time, the Knox County Sheriff's Office is attempting to identify the unknown vehicle that caused the accident. Anyone with information about this incident is asked to contact the Knox County Sheriff's Office or your local Law Enforcement Agency.

On Aug. 15, 2014, the O'Neill Police Department and the Holt County Sheriff's Office were involved in a vehicle pursuit of a man from O'Neill, Nebraska. It had been reported earlier, to the Holt County Officials, that the man was suicidal and possibly had a pistol. The Holt County Sheriff's Office lost contact with the man's vehicle in northern

Holt County, A Nebraska Game and Parks Conservation Officer had contact with the vehicle on Highway 12 in western Knox County. The man refused to stop for the officer and the Nebraska State Patrol became involved.

The man ran over a gate across a maintenance trail that used to be the old rail road tracks along the Missouri River on the northern edge of the Niobrara State Park. He then left the vehicle and ran away from officers on foot.

After a search involving numerous officers and dogs the man gave up to officers and was taken into custody. He was transported to Faith Regional Campus in Norfolk NE for a mental evaluation. Reports will be forwarded to the County Attorneys of the counties involved to determine what criminal charges will be filed.

Agencies involved include O'Neill Police Department, Holt County Sheriff's Office, Nebraska Game and Parks, Nebraska State Patrol, Niobrara Police Department, and Knox County Sheriff's Office. Personnel with the Niobrara State Park also helped with handling campers and other people at the park during the search.
