#### Superintendent's Compendium, Missouri National Recreational River

The National Park Service (NPS) recently updated the Superintendent's Compendium for the Missouri National Recreational River to include an immediate ban on the use of unmanned aircraft within the jurisdictional boundaries of the Park. The ban is compliant with a Service-wide policy memorandum (14-05) issued by the Director of the National Park Service dated June 19, 2014. The Superintendent's Compendium is a document containing park-specific regulations based on the superintendent's authority under 36 Code of Regulations (C.F.R.) 1.5 to close all or a portion of a park or otherwise limit an activity to maintain public health and safety, protect environmental or scenic values, protect natural or cultural resources, implement management responsibilities, equitably allocate and use facilities, or avoid conflict among visitor activities. Other components of the Superintendent's Compendium that may be of interest to communities adjacent to Missouri National Recreational River boundaries from Fort Randall Dam to Ponca State Park, excluding Lewis and Clark Lake and the Gavins Point Dam area, include:

36 C.F.R. 1.6 pertaining to activities that require a permit to be issued by the Park:

• §2.5 (a) Specimens collection (Take plant, fish, wildlife, rocks or minerals) - Removal of wildlife for purposes other than those under legal hunting, fishing or trapping as regulated through Nebraska and South Dakota state laws and regulations.

• §2.50 (a) Conduct a sports event, pageant, regatta, public spectator attraction, entertainment, ceremony, and similar special use events

36 C.F.R. Part 3 pertaining to boating and water use activities:

• §3.8 (a) (1) Launching or operating an air-boat is prohibited

§3.9 (a) Launching or operating personal watercraft ("jet ski") is prohibited
