## **National Publication Ranks USD** School Of Law 'Best Value' For Fourth Year In A Row

VERMILLION — The University of South Dakota School of Law has been ranked as the fifth "Best Value" law school in the nation for the fourth consecutive year by preLaw magazine, a National Jurist publication.

In addition to bar passage, the magazine's rankings take into account in-state tuition, debt and the percent of graduates employed nine months after getting their degree. The top 20 list is featured in the August issue of preLaw magazine and is dominated by public law schools, including the top five schools on the list.

"Being ranked a 'best value' demonstrates the commitment our institution has to providing a quality, reputable legal education at an affordable cost.
