BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were lower Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for Dec delivery fell 7.75 cents to \$5.5450 a bushel; Dec corn was 4.75 cents lower at 3.6675 a bushel; Dec oats were down 3.75 cents to \$3.5150 a bushel; while Nov soybeans declined 12.75 cents to \$10.2925 a bushel.

Beef and pork were higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

Oct live cattle rose 1.15 cents to \$1.4815 a pound; Oct feeder cattle was 2.28 cents higher at \$2.1175 a pound; while Oct lean hogs gain .58 cent to \$.9345 a pound.
