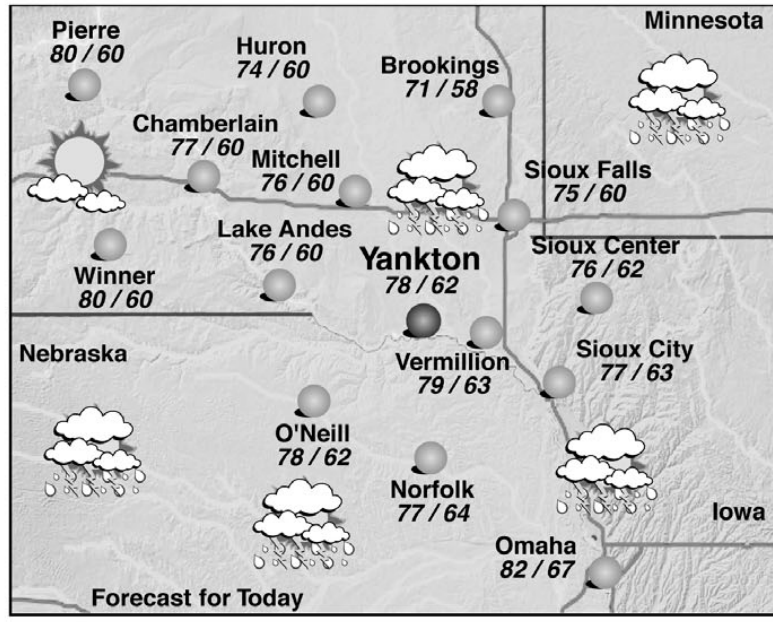
Yankton's Forecast

NEW YORK (AP) — U.S. stocks drifted mostly higher Wednesday as the Standard & Poor's 500 index set a record for the third day in a row.

ON WEDNESDAY: The Dow Jones industrial average rose 15.31 points, or 0.1 percent, to 17,122.01.

FOR THE WEEK: The Dow is up 120.79 points, or 0.7 percent. The S&P 500 index is up 11.72 points, or 0.6 percent.

FOR THE YEAR: The Dow is up 545.35 points, or 3.3 percent. The S&P 500 index is up 151.76 points, or 8.2 percent.
