Reiff Grows Into Leader For Trojans

Parkston All-Stater, Iowa Commit Aims For Return Trip To DakotaDome

PARKSTON — Brady Reiff had surgery earlier this year to repair an injured left shoul-

Whv? Put simply: Though the only Division I recruit, he's far from the only standout on a Parkston team that lost in the state championship game a

"We're going to come back this year and hopefully have a better season; get that championship," Reiff said during Parkston's first practice on Aug. 14.

That's the goal for Reiff, a University of Iowa commit and younger brother of NFL player Riley Reiff, and his Trojan teammates: Work their way back to the DakotaDome in Vermillion, site of the state football finals.

"It's fun to work your way back up there, to stay motivated to get that championship," said Reiff, who is fully healed from that surgery earlier this year.

Naturally, that was a popular topic in the nine months since that loss — even despite another state wrestling title for Parkston, including many of the same names from foot-

"It makes us more anxious to get back there, because we don't want that feeling again," said senior Wes Dvorak, a returning all-state defensive back who also starts at quarterback.

The Trojans, 10-2 a year ago, graduated eight seniors from the Class 11B runner-up

They do, however, return three of four all-state players: Reiff, Dvorak and senior lineman Austin Bertram.

Last season as a junior, Reiff caught seven passes for

147 yards from his tight end spot, and also carried the ball 51 times for 298 yards. On defense, he was used at linebacker and as a down lineman.

Reiff's maturation into a D-I prospect — Reiff reportedly had offers from Wyoming and South Dakota State — took a big step forward in ways not found on a stat sheet, according to head coach Eric Nor-

"Physically he's growing up, getting a lot stronger and quicker, but a lot of it was mental." Norden said.

Now, as one of those seniors that underclassmen look

up to, Reiff said he realizes the responsibilities attached to the 'leader' label.

"It's a big step to really step up and be a leader," Reiff said. "But it'll help out our team, and hopefully the other seniors can do the same thing.

Among the other seniors are Dvorak, Bertram, Seth Newton, Lane Konrad, Ethan Murtha, Miles Semmler, Nate Oberembt, Tanner Reichert, Dillon Stadlman, Cameron Fanning, Jeff Hyke, Tanner Lindeman and Caleb Horstman.

Not exactly ready to talk 'dome' for the Trojans in 2014, coach Norden was, however, rather optimistic in the talent he has back this fall.

'The expectations are certainly there, we hope to do

very well, to get ourselves in a great position," Norden said.


Following a quarterfinal run in the 2012 playoffs and a state title game appearance in 2013, the Trojans realize winning a championship is possible, Dvorak said.


