## Quick Hitters

■ This is not only the first time South Dakota State has faced Missouri, it is the Jackrabbits' first matchup against any team from the Southeast Conference.

■ SDSU head coach John Stiegelmeier will likely become the winningest football coach in Jackrabbit history this season. He trails Ralph Ginn (1947-68; 113-89-9 record) by just three victories, entering his 18th season with a 111-81 record.

■ Missouri head coach Gary Pinkel, entering his 14th season, already holds the Tigers' coaching victories mark at 102.

■ South Dakota State RB Zach Zenner has rushed for 2,000 yards in consecutive seasons. He's the second player in FCS to do that and needs 218 yards in senior season to become Missouri Valley career leader.

■ Missouri TB Russell Hansbrough gets first starting shot after gaining 685 yards with 4 TDs as backup. DE Markus Golden had 61-2 sacks last season.

■ South Dakota State quarterback Austin Sumner already holds Jackrabbit career records for completions (631), attempts (1,085) and yards (7,824). He is seven touchdown passes from the Jacks' career record in that category.

## Key Matchup

**Missouri's unproven wide receivers against the South Dakota State secondary.** The top three producers are gone, with Bud Sasser (26 catches) and Jimmie Hunt (22) the top returning targets for Maty Mauk, who was 3-1 as stand-in starter last season.

## Quick Hitters

■ This was supposed to be the Pelini Bowl, but the matchup between coaches Bo Pelini of Nebraska and Carl Pelini of FAU isn't to be after Carl's ugly departure from FAU with four games left last season. The Cornhuskers believe the pieces are in place for a breakthrough after losing four games each of Bo's six years in Lincoln. The Owls of Conference USA won their last four games and hope to keep the momentum going under new coach Charlie Partridge.

■ The Owls love to play the big boys. They took on Miami and Auburn last year and Georgia and Alabama in 2012, and they'll travel to

'Bama again next week.

■ Nebraska begins its 125th season of football and ranks fourth all-time in victories. FAU begins its 14th season.

■ The Huskers have won 28 straight openers.

■ Florida Atlantic QB Jacquez Johnson was C-USA's newcomer of the year after rushing for 772 yards, passing for 1,876 and accounting for 22 touchdowns.

■ The Owls are the first of four opponents that Nebraska will face for the second time in school history, including Big Ten newcomer Rutgers. The Huskers are 1-0 against all four opponents.

## Key Matchup

**Florida Atlantic receivers vs. Nebraska secondary.** Expect the Owls to test a secondary that will have a new starter at cornerback and lost its starting nickel back to injury and a starting safety to suspension. FAU's William Dukes is one of C-USA's best receivers and a big-play threat.

■ "Now the test will come. Once we get to the first game, the question will be can we apply what we've learned? Can we react with 93,000 in the stands?" **Nebraska head coach Bo Pelini.**

And then there's the five returning offensive lineman and the Pac-12 top returning rusher in Bryon Marshall (1038 yds, 14 TD).

Duplicating Oregon's speed in practice was something the Coyotes tried all week, Glenn said.

"The only thing you can do is try your hardest," he said. "You have to be ready and take coaching, and go through scouting reports."

Easier said than done. Guziec, though, did find a silver lining in facing Oregon's speed — the Coyotes won't see anyone faster the rest of the season.

"This speed is something we've never seen. You don't see speed like this," Guziec said. "The next couple games after this might feel like slow motion."

At the end of the day, the Coyotes are a confident group.

That, their coach knows for sure.

"They believe in themselves, they know they're well-trained and physical and strong," Glenn said.

"They're not afraid, I can promise you that."

Garretson was led by Haley Sage (15:27.99), who finished just behind Lavin in fifth place. Beresford was led by Cait Savey (15:36.81), who placed sixth.

In the boys' race, Elk Point-Jefferson's Hunter Paulsen finished in 17:09.61, easily outdistancing Garretson's Evan Fick (17:47.59) for top honors.

"I hadn't had a lot of competition during the summer, so I just wanted to go out and run my race," Paulsen said. "It's a good start to the season. Hopefully I can keep it up through the rest of it."

Sioux Falls Christian won the team title, led by third place finisher Caleb DeWeerd (17:50.60) and fourth place finisher Lance Van Zee (17:53.63). The Chargers' finish was an exciting start for a young squad, according to head coach Luke VanderLeest.

"We're led by a sophomore, with four freshmen right behind him, so we're

pretty excited about the season and what lies ahead," he said. "Our boys had a great summer of training, and they were eager to have an opportunity to let all those hard miles pay off in a meet."

Lennox, led by fifth place finisher Nathan Timmerman (17:53.81), finished second to the Chargers, 37-41. Garretson was third with 59 points.

Twenty-three schools were represented in the meet, with over 500 runners between the varsity and sub-varsity races. With the regular course on The Bridges Golf Course unavailable due to recent rains, organizers set up an alternate course that began on Maple Street in front of Beresford High School and ended on the BHS track.

"It was one of the first, if not the first, meet of the year in the state. It almost had a 'Midnight Madness' feel to it," Buffington said. "It was a great environment."
