Vermillion stopped a fourth-down Lennox run at the their goal line and took over on downs with 5:50 to go. That would be enough to cement a second straight opening night win. A 60-yard pass from Brown to Matt Ouellette set up the Tanagers on their first drive with the ball at the Lennox three. The Orioles' defense stiffened and the hosts were denied an early score. Vermillion turned over Lennox on downs and took advantage immediately if not

easily. After struggling to get yards Brown found Regan Bye up the middle on third down for a 15-yard scoring pass and the Tanagers led 7-0. On its next drive Lennox benefitted from a 51-yard kickoff return and would score on the first play of the second quarter. Jacob Lackas scored on an eight-yard, fourth down run and the game was tied 7-7. Lennox got the ball back moments later on an interception and scored 11 plays and five-plus minutes later on a John Oldenkamp nine-yard run with 5:34 left in the first half. Trailing 14-7, Vermillion shook off the Oriole momen-

tum by delivering sweetness via air mail. Brown hooked up with Brandon Mockler for a 74-yard screen and see-ya touchdown and he game was tied at 14-all only 29 seconds later. Carter Kratz picked off a Lennox pass late in the half and then things got interesting. Brown tickled the air-waves with a long, lofting 53-yard scoring pass to Ouellette with 10 seconds to go in the quarter and Vermillion headed into the locker room up 20-14. Lennox started the second half with a decent drive but Tyler Madsen picked off a fourth-down Oriole pass and Vermillion kept the momen-

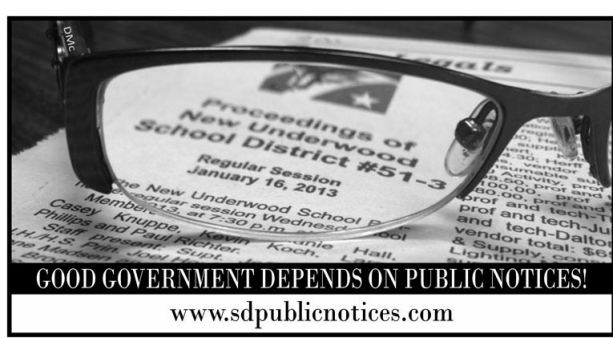

Jackrabbits' running back is one of two FCS players ever to have two 2,000-yards rushing seasons and needs only 218 more yards to tie Western Illinois' Herb Donaldson for the conference's career rushing mark at 4,746. Zenner will have to contend Saturday, though, with a Missouri defensive line that led the SEC with 41 sacks and 108 tackles for loss last season. MISSOURI'S OFFENSE: Maty Mauk takes over at quarterback with four career starts and a 51.1 career completion percentage, and he won't have the Tigers' top three receivers and top run-

ning back from last season to turn to for help. He will, however, have five upperclassmen protecting him on the offensive line. How the offense gels as a unit is one of the team's biggest question marks entering the season. AUSTIN SUMNER: South Dakota State's quarterback already holds school records in completions (631), attempts (1,085) and passing

yards (7,824). His favorite target will be first-team all-MVFC receiver Jason Schneider, who had a school-record 78 catches for 1,088 yards and 10 touchdowns a year ago. But the Jackrabbits need other receivers to emerge after the graduations of Trevor Tiefenthaler (45 catches, 547 yards) and Brandon Hubert (36 catches, 423 yards, four touchdowns).
