Yankton Goes 1-1 To Open 15-16 **Minors Tourney**

Yankton defeated Sioux Falls East, 5-4, on day one of the 15-16 VFW Minors State Baseball Tournament Friday night in Yankton.

Sioux Falls East was able to strike first in the top of the second inning after an error by the shortstop, scoring one to take the lead. In the bottom half Yankton didn't waste anytime responding, after Trey Bakke scored on an error by the centerfielder and Kellen Franzen drove in two runs with a single, to make the score, 3-1.

Caid Koletzky got the start going four innings, allowing just one run on two hits, five walks and striking out five, before being relived by Franzen to start the fifth.

East was able to tie the game at three, on a play that included a double steal and an error by the Yanton catcher, that scored Nick Marnin and Conner Cosini in the top of the fifth. The next inning East was able to add on another run with an RBI-single from Marnin.

Yankton's offense was sparked in the bottom of the sixth by a lead off double from Jack Shoenfelder, who later scored on a double steal to re-tie the game at four. Later in the inning Carter Peterson scored from second on an infield single by Nate Eickacker. Franzen then went on to pitch a one-two-three inning in the top of the seventh to end the game and earn

BROOKINGS — The bats for Yankton Post 12 were held in check Friday night.

It wasn't as though Yankton was totally shut down, but missed opportunities told the story.

In the rematch of the 2014 final, Post 22 defeated Yankton 5-2 in the winners bracket game of the S.D. State Class A American Legion Baseball Tournament in Brookings.

The loss sends Yankton to today's (Saturday) elimination game with hometown Brookings at 1 p.m. A win would send Yankton to Sunday's championship day, where it would need to beat

Post 22 twice for the title. Yankton (29-18), which had scored 29 runs over the first two games, certainly had its chances Friday. It, however, stranded 15 runners - including the bases loaded on two occasions and two in the bottom of the ninth.

A team that has peppered tournament pitchers with

line drives scored its first run Friday on a pair of errors.

Jordan Kathol reached first on a throwing error by the pitcher in the bottom of the fourth inning, then came around to score on an error by the shortstop.

The pitchers duel came to an end in the sixth, when Post 22 got an RBI double from Erik Petry and a two-run homer from Timmy Paris.

Each team added a run in the eighth, including an RBI single by Yankton's Sheldon Gant, but Post 22 maintained a 5-2 lead after eight innings.

Colin Muth took the loss for Yankton, after throwing 115 pitches in six innings. He was relieved by Landon Withrow, who went the final three frames.

Brad Ulmer, Gant, Kathol and Austin Johnson all had two hits, while Adam Walter had the other hit in a losing effort.

Zach Solono was 4-5 to lead Rapid City Post 22 (48-13), which moves into today's

Tougher Schedules As Playoff Push

CHICAGO (AP) -Hoping to set themselves apart when playoff selection time comes around. Big Ten teams plan to play at least one nonconference game against a Power Five opponent and eliminate FCS schools from their schedules starting in 2016 when the league goes to a ninegame conference slate.

Commissioner Jim Delany touted the league's "1910" scheduling model on Friday at Big Ten media days: one Power Five nonconference game, nine conference games, one conference championship game, zero games outside Bowl Subdivision.

The Big Ten would become the only Power Five conference to play nine league games, eliminate FCS opponents and require a Power Five

nonconference game. Delany said the scheduling guidelines are

not a mandate, though he believes they will make an impression on the playoff selection committee. The Big Ten has been working its future scheduling model for several years, but this week was an opportunity for Delany to tie it all together on a

big stage. Delany said games in Notre Dame and BYU, both independents, would count as Power Five opponents and the FCS games will be weaned off Big Ten schedules so its schools would not have to break current contracts.
