Mingo, Getz Defend Two-Woman Title

BRANDON — South Dakota State teammates Megan Mingo and Hallie Getz teamed up for a five-stroke victory in the open division of the South Dakota Golf Association's two-woman championship, held Saturday and Sunday at Brandon Golf course. The two also won the title in 2014. Mingo, of Yankton, and Getz, of Pierre, shot a first-round 67 to take a three-stroke lead into Sunday's round, then followed with a 68, matching the best score of the day. Jill Moliner and Karla Cotton, both of Sioux Falls, teamed for a two-day score of 140, shooting 68 on Sunday. Parkston's Jordan Bormann and Sydney Weber finished third at 141. The victory is Mingo's fourth SDGA title, adding to junior titles she won in 2010 and 2013. Getz also has four career titles, including the mixed team championship earlier this year (with Matt Johnson) and women's amateur title in 2014. Freeman High School grad Brooke Hermen teamed with Tiffany Roderick to win the net second division. Yankton's Lisa Berry and Carla Ewald beat out Yankton's Sandy Brandt and Lisa Rothschild by one stroke to win the senior third flight.
