Nelson said there are still some nerves due to the previous experience.

"I do think a fall letting gives us a little more opportunity because (contractors) probably haven't planned out all their projects for spring," she said. "But there's always an element of concern just because of the amount of projects they already have going. I think with a fall letting, we'll see some good, competitive bids."

She added that, in light of recent discussions of a proposed Yankton bypass, that Highway 50 improvements in the City of Yankton should be pursued no matter what.

"A bypass is something that's been talked about recently and something we'll probably continue to talk about in the future," she said. "I think that's a community conversation and a county conversation and a state conversation that I think we should continue to have, but I don't think, in any way, we should think of that in lieu of the Highway 50 project. That's a necessary improvement in our community and we need to do the utility improvements as well. We're already down the road on that project and we need to follow through, and I believe that's the intention of the state as well."

Nelson said the 2016 budget will also be a little bit less than last year's due to the completion of various projects.

"We are about \$1 million — give or take a little — less budgeted than last year," she said. "That's really because we're borrowing less, but we're paying it back. It's really a reflection of borrowing less money because we've completed some of our capital improvements."

The budget is set to be introduced during the commission's Aug. 24 meeting and voted on during its Sept. 14 meeting.

During Tuesday's ceremony, Wagner mayor Don Hosek greeted the audience and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

"What a wonderful day," he said. "A somber one, but a wonderful day."

The mayor alluded to the strong support shown by the packed gymnasium. "We are gathered to show support, and support is what we will give you," he said.

Hosek said he knows firsthand the challenges of a deployment for both the soldiers and their loved ones.

"I know the pain and separation from family during wartime," he said. "Brighter days are on the horizon. Wagner will be waiting for your (soldiers') return."

During Tuesday's program, SGM (retired) Vernon Sip said the Wagner ceremony and packed gymnasium restored his faith in America's commitment to its troops.

"There would be times I would question America's patriotism, but today shows it's alive and well," he said.

Lt. Col. David Dailey, the 153rd Engineer Battalion commander, praised the 155th as one of the best vertical engineer companies he has seen. He noted the unit's excellent not only in military situations but in work such as the NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Complex.

He recognized the soldiers' professionalism honed to "a razor's edge" through its pre-deployment training. He also recognized the families and communities supporting the soldiers back home.

Capt. David Dodson, the company commander of the 155th Engineer Company, noted the company's outstanding history of responding to any mission no matter its difficulty.

After the ceremony, family members expressed pride in the Wagner unit.

"How do you describe your feelings? PROUD," said Dana Sanderson and the father of Adam Sanderson.

Dana plans to attend the Rapid City ceremony, but he said the Wagner ceremony was important for the unit.

"It lets the community show how they feel. It shows we care," he said. "Wagner is a very patriotic community. There are a lot of National

Guard and full-time soldiers and veterans in the area."

Tyndall resident LeWayne Lukkes, who was a staff sergeant and squad leader in the 2002-03 mission, retired from the military after two years in the U.S. Marine Corps and 30 years in the National Guard.

On Tuesday, he was in the audience to support his nephew, Spec. Justin Lukkes of Avon.

"I think it definitely helps out the younger ones to have the older soldiers with combat experience, because they can share the things they experienced," LeWayne said. "They'll watch out for each other and do fine. If the Good Lord's willing and the creek don't rise, they'll all be home."

The upcoming mission will be different than 2002-03 in one respect, LeWayne said.

"Before, we had no idea what we were going to see in Iraq. It was different, and it wasn't a friendly place to go to," he said. "As far as terrorism, I don't think it's ever going to leave. It's part of us now. The world is a different place than it was 10 years ago."

SSG Mike Kotab, now with the 196th MEB, was part of the Wagner unit's mission to Iraq and attended Tuesday's send-off.

"This brings memories, bittersweet ones," he said.

Kotab noted one difference between the two missions.

"They had a year's notice this time. When we deployed in 2003, we had one month's notice. It was a lot shorter time," he said. "On the flip side, they've had a year to think about it. That's one of the hardest things."

Kotab credited the community for its strong showing for the National Guard. "Wagner has been great support for the Guard at the state and local level," he said.

That support needs to continue during the trying times of the next year, said Jody Kotab, Mike's wife and the family support group leader during the previous deployment.

"(The families) need to support each other and ask for help," she said. "And we need to make sure we support the troops and their families, and let them know we care."

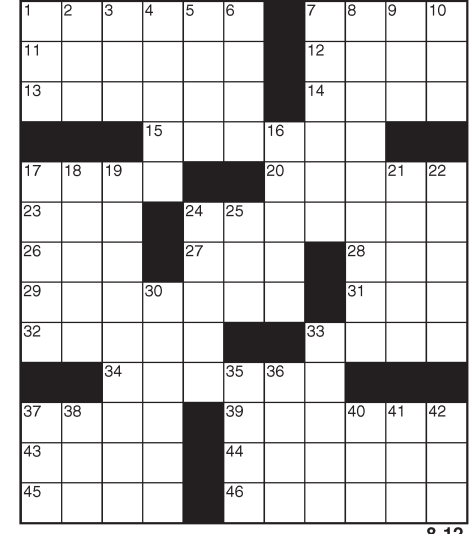
