

When the new building is complete, it will be classified as a Traditional building and serve 1st through 12th graders. Members pay \$25 a year.

The new Traditional Club includes space for 1st through 5th graders and a space for the 6th through 12th graders. The building will include a gym, social space, game zones, homework rooms, art rooms and a cafeteria. CHICAGO (AP) - Grain futures were lower Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for September delivery was off 18.25 cents to \$5.0725 a bushel; December corn lost 13.50 cents to 3.8750 a bushel; December oats fell 7.75 cents to 2.40 a bushel; while November soybeans

declined 23 cents to \$9.7150 a bushel.

Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. October live cattle was off .15 cent to \$1.4915 a pound; August feeder cattle fell .18 cent to \$2.1407 a pound; while October lean hogs lost .62 cents to \$.6235 a pound.

WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks closed lower on Monday, led by declines in materials stocks as commodity prices dropped. The price of oil fell to a six year low Tuesday after OPEC said its production increased and China devalued its currency, suggesting economic growth there was weakening, which could result in lower demand for oil.


