WALL ST. RECAP

Another weakening of China's currency sent U.S. markets sharply lower Wednesday, but by the end of the day major indexes recovered nearly all the ground they had lost earlier. The Dow Jones industrial average had been down as much as 277 points.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were lower Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
Wheat for September delivery was off 15 cents to \$4.9225 a bushel; December corn lost 19.50 cents to 3.68 a bushel; December oats fell .25 cents to 2.3975 a bushel; while November soybeans declined 61.50 cents to \$9.10 a bushel.
Beef was lower and pork was higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. October live cattle was off 2.55 cents to \$1.4660 a pound; August feeder cattle fell .20 cent to \$2.1387 a pound; while October lean hogs gained 1.02 cents to \$6.337 a pound.
