"We want other board to understand what these exemplary boards have done and illustrate what good boardsmanship looks like," Pogany said. "I think the Yankton board is a good example of that.

The School Board of Excellence Award is given annually to a public school board which consistently demonstrated outstanding leadership in these qualities to promote public education.

'The work they have done with the community in terms of some of the grants they received is one of the things that really stood out to us," Pogany said. "One of many.

Yankton School District was awarded a \$280,000 Governor's CTE Grant through the Governor's Office of Economic Development. The grant was used to prepare students with skills in high-need job areas and skills to enter the workforce after education.

The Yankton School Board also measures the level of learning by assessments including the National Career Readiness Certificate, The Smarter Balanced Test and TMS Career Explorations Classes.

"Clearly they monitor their school's achievement with the students," Pogany

That attention to details suggests the Yankton School Board not only wants to plan on improving student learning but to make sure the plans are successful. In addition, board members also want to make sure their own learning is successful as well.

"One of the things that helped us get this award is Kathy Greenway," Pietz said. "When she was president, she really encouraged all of us to go through the GAVEL training through the ASBSD board."

The Governance Academy of Visionary Education Leadership (GAVEL) training consists of two levels. The first helps members understand the financial side of the school district, strategic planning and governance overall.

"It really makes you think about all the different

things that go on behind the scenes the decisions that you make and how it affects things throughout the school district," Pietz

said. The Yankton School Board made a goal of every member to have one aspect of the GAVEL levels done every month. In December, every member was certified. Dr. Pogany came down to Yankton and presented each member with their certificate of completion.

"It is actually very rare to have every member of a school board be GAVEL certified," Pogany said.

The board also worked with Lewis and Clark Behavior Health to fund for a school resource officer in the high school and middle school. A family counselor and a full-time Drug/ Alcohol counselor was put on school staff to help students with issues that may arise throughout the district.

"The ASBSD is delighted that the Yankton school board has won this," Pogany said. "They have worked hard, and I think things are in good shape in Yankton."

Not only does this award highlight the accomplishments the board has made, but it also keeps them looking ahead to future decision making plans.

"I think one of the things on the horizon right now is the discussion with Crane Youngworth and where we are going to go with that,' Pietz said. "Another big piece to that is the comprehensive facilities study to look at all the buildings throughout the district, we are hoping to get some response from the community on that as well.'

As the board prepares itself for the years ahead, this award allows community members to value all that the Yankton School Board has done to improve local education. That recognition sparks appreciate and motivation for the future. "It's not just an award

for the board or the people on the board, it's an award for the whole district and the community in itself," Pietz said. "They are the ones who elected us to these positions.....It just goes to show that the community is doing a good job in picking who they want represented on the board.

Jury Convicts Man Of 2003 Kidnapping

MADISON, Neb. (AP) — A 49-year-old man will be sent to prison for life after being convicted of a 2003 kidnapping in northeast Nebraska.

Rosario Betancourt-Garcia was convicted Wednesday in Madison County District Court of kidnapping, conspiracy and use of a firearm. His trial began Monday.

Court records say Betancourt-Garcia was identified by his then-21-year-old victim as having been one of two men who kidnapped and terrorized him on Nov. 15, 2003. The other man, Jose Luis Trevino, was convicted in 2005 and sent to

Officials say Betancourt-Garcia was mistakenly deported to Mexico shortly after the crimes occurred. He returned to the United States and lived in Texas until he was arrested in 2013 and extradited to Nebraska.

Verdict **Could Come** Next Week

UNITED NATIONS (AP) — U.N. human rights experts on Friday called on Iran to immediately release a Washington Post reporter who has been detained for more than a year on charges including espionage and distributing propaganda against the Islamic Republic. A verdict on Jason Rezaian's case could come as early as next week.

The statement says the detention and closed-door trial violate the Iranian-American reporter's rights and serve to intimidate other journalists in Iran. It says his solitary confinement and full-day interrogation sessions "caused significant physical and psychological strain."

The statement was issued by the special rapporteurs for freedom of expression and for human rights in Iran and by the head of the working group on arbitrary detention.

Washington Post Executive Editor Martin Baron said the statement "comes at a critical moment" and upholds the newspaper's stance that Iran's conduct in the case has been illegal. He called the trial a "sham.'

Both the newspaper and Rezaian's family have said they believe the reporter is a victim of the hostility between Iran and the United States that dates back to the

1979 Islamic Revolution.
