HURON — The South Dakota State Fair will host its first ever Build A Bird contest at this year's fair and we want you to participate. Sponsored by the South Dakota Poultry Industries Association, competitors will test their creative talents utilizing any materials to create a poultry or fowl exhibit in the contest.

The exhibits will be on display in the Poultry Barn for the length of the fair. Judging categories include Most Creative and Most Life-like and will be broken down to ages 17 and younger and ages 18 and older. A \$100 prize will be awarded to the top winner in each category, with a \$50 prize for second place. Entries will be judged on Friday, Sept. 4, and must preregister prior to Aug. 29. KNOX CO. SHERIFF'S REPORT

With schools across the county starting, the Knox County Attorney's Office and the Knox County Sheriff's Office would like to remind everyone that school buses are stopping to pick up young school kids. Please obey the law and stop for the school buses.

This law was designed for the safety of young children, who at times have to cross the road to get on the bus or off the bus. The minimum fine assessed for passing a school is \$500 plus court costs. If a child is struck by a vehicle while the bus has the warning lights and/or stop sign out, additional felony charges can and would be filed. Please watch for school buses, the lights and the children. If you observe a person passing a bus with the lights and/or stop sign out, if you can safely do so without endangering the child or others, please call the sheriff's office with license plate number and vehicle description of the vehicle passing the bus.
