Order of authority is imperative in a moralistic and just society. Without authority chaos reigns. God, being the ultimate authority. has ordained the institution of government; "For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God" (Romans 13:1). Furthermore Paul states that government "is God's servant for your good." Surprising as it may be to some, nowhere in Scripture does God call for government to preach the Gospel. In general, governments provide justice and security of their people.

The people of the United States, in particular, have called for a government "Of the people, by the people, for the people" to protect their God-given rights to freedom of worship and continue to demand of its government protection and security above everything else. Therefore the question is this, who should an American vote for in any given election?

Many well-meaning people, including Christian's, often sit out an election because they find themselves unhappy with the theology of the individual.
