Religion And Politics

Order of authority is imperative in a moralistic and just society. Without authority chaos reigns. God, being the ultimate authority, has ordained the institution of government; "For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God" (Romans 13:1). Furthermore Paul states that government "is God's servant for your good." Surprising as it may be to some, nowhere in Scripture does God call for government to preach the Gospel. In general, governments provide justice and security of their people. The people of the United States, in particular, have called for a government "Of

the people, by the people, for the people" to protect their God-given rights to freedom of worship and continue to demand of its government protection and security above everything else. Therefore the question is this, who should an American vote for in any given election? Many well-meaning people, including Christian's, often sit out an election because they find themselves unhappy with the theology of the individual. Being a Christian running for public office does not guarantee the person will understand the role of government. Any person best qualified to protect the American Constitution should get our vote. Furthermore, if there is no person of my faith running for office, it

is still incumbent on me to vote for the person who will best fulfill the role of government that God intends. Sadly, many Christians wrote off Mitt Romney simply because he was a Mormon and yet we find several years down the road that Romney understood government much better than we gave him credit for. Christian voters make up approximately 25-30% of American voters. It is clear by all accounts that Christians will not, in and of themselves, guarantee a certain candidate will win. However, Christians should never think they can't make a difference. We should keep in mind that God raises up strong, proven leaders, both Christian and non-Christian, who are able and willing

to provide for protection, justice, and free worship of its citizens. Most of the latest major polls show that well more than half of all Americans believe the country is in steep moral and financial decline, and are in fear of ISIS in particular. It is evident that we are living in a very peculiar time. Therefore, it is vital that we all vote in 2016. It is important, now more than ever, that regardless what side of the religious or political spectrum you find yourself on that your voice is heard so that we may extend the life of this nation through those who will guard our constitution, protect us from our enemies, and provide truth through justice.
