







# Blessing, Ribbon Cutting For New Apartments Set

Yankton Heights Apartments, a \$4.1 million, 30 unit multi-family affordable housing complex located at 1200 W. 30th Street in the Fox Run Development, will hold a blessing and ribbon cutting on Wednesday, Sept. 2, at 11:30 a.m.

Bishop Paul Swain will be present to bless the facility and a number of local and state housing leaders will be present for the ribbon cutting, including Yankton Mayor David Carda, and representatives of the South Dakota Housing Development Authority, Wells Fargo and Costello Companies.

Lunch and tours will follow the blessing and ribbon cutting.

The three-story building has six one bedroom units, 16 two-bedroom units and eight three bedroom units, plus a clubhouse (with a kitchen), manager's office, two bathrooms and maintenance storage.

Yankton Heights will serve families and individuals of all ages. Three units are designed to accommodate persons with disabilities (one for the hearing or visually-impaired and two for mobility-impaired persons.) The 38,372 square

foot building architecturally is called the "E-Urban" plan, a patented architectural plan developed by Humphreys and Partners Architects.

Yankton Heights Apartments is owned by Yankton Heights Limited Partnership, in which St. Joseph Catholic Housing Inc. is the general partner and Wells Fargo Affordable Housing Community Development Corporation is the limited partner. The apartments have rents structured for tenants at 30-60 percent of the area median income. The owner will maintain the affordable rents for 40 years.

Financing is being provided by Wells Fargo Bank with additional funding through the Housing Tax Credit, HOME and Housing Opportunity Fund programs administered by South Dakota Housing Development Authority. Costello Companies provided consulting services and will manage the apartments. Costello Construction was the general contractor.

Amenities at the Yankton Heights site include high efficiency central air conditioners and furnaces; washers and dryers in each unit; all appliances, includ-

ing a refrigerator, stove, microwave/hood combo, dishwasher; and window blinds. Each unit is wired for phone, cable TV and high speed internet service. The main entrances have a secure access system. Tenants are responsible for electric and gas utilities, telephone, internet and cable TV and the complex pays for water, sewer and garbage service.

Outside there is a children's playground, park benches, bike racks and a picnic area with a picnic table and grill. The landscaping includes trees and an underground sprinkler system. There are 50 surface area parking spaces.

There are a number of "green" features included in the Yankton Heights development such as rain sensors for the lawn sprinkler system, low flow faucets, showerheads and toilets, Energy Star appliances, energy saving light bulbs and low VOC carpet and low VOC paint, stains and adhesives. Each unit is Energy Star Certified by Johnson Environmental, a third party HERS (Home Energy Rating System) rater.

## WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks closed mostly higher on Friday, capping a volatile week.

Stocks fell heavily in the first two days of trading this week on concerns about the health of China's economy. The market then rebounded sharply as investors decided to scoop up bargains.

For the day:  
The Dow fell 11.76 points, or 0.1 percent, to 16,643.01.  
The Standard & Poor's 500 index rose 1.21 points, or 0.1 percent, to 1,988.87.

The Nasdaq composite added 15.62 points, or 0.3 percent,

to 4,828.32.  
For the week:  
The Dow is up 183.26 points, or 1.1 percent.

The S&P 500 index is up 17.98 points, or 0.9 percent.  
The Nasdaq is up 122.29 points, or 2.6 percent.

For the year:  
The Dow is down 1,180.06 points, or 6.6 percent.

The S&P 500 index is down 70.03 points, or 3.4 percent.  
The Nasdaq is up 92.27 points, or 2 percent.

## BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mixed Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery was off 6 cents to \$4.8375 a bushel; December corn was unchanged at 3.75 a bushel; December oats were up 6.5 cents to 2.285 a bushel; while November soybeans ad-

vanced 6.5 cents to \$8.855 bushel. Beef rose while pork fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. October live cattle was up 1.42 cents to \$1.4397 a pound; October feeder cattle rose 1.85 cents to \$1.9892 a pound; while October lean hogs lost .63 cent to \$6.642 a pound.


