As I was sitting at the computer late Saturday night, I got a Twitter message with the following tidbit: "Con-sider the search over." Naturally, I was curious. The subject was obvious; something was happening in the University of South Dakota's ongoing search for a new head football coach. A few messages later, and after ones from two others, I figured it out: It was going to be Joe Glenn. It hasn't been made official by USD, but you can expect a formal announcement today (Monday) in Vermillion to name the 62-year-old Glenn the newest Coyote coach.

## Expected Hire Of Joe Glenn An Interesting — And Bold — Move

Slice it however you want, it's an interesting — and bold — move. Glenn is a former USD player and 1971 graduate who went on to win three national championships in his 24 years as a head coach at Doane, Northern Colorado, Montana and Wyoming. It seems perfectly fitting that a USD program that sought a new direction would hand the reins to an alumnus. Glenn is certainly no stranger to the Coyote community (he is already in the athletic Hall of Fame, for one) and will bring instant excitement to a team that begins Missouri Valley Football Conference play next fall. Some will argue that Glenn hasn't coached in three years since being fired by Wyoming in 2008, and that he hasn't been on the recruiting trail — especially in this area. Though, he is certainly a nice "get" by athletic director David Saylor, who said last week that the coaching vacancy had brought "high" interest — with at least 40 resumes having been submitted. Either way, one of USD's own is back, and only time will tell whether it's the right move.

**CREIGHTON 76, NEBRASKA 66: OMAHA, Neb. (AP)** — Doug McDermott had 24 points to lead Creighton to a 76-66 victory over Nebraska on Sunday. McDermott made three free throws after a pair of technical fouls were called on the Cornhuskers with 9:14 left. Nebraska's Tonye McCray was called for a technical foul after he fouled Creighton's Grant Gibbons. Saylor, who coached the technical on McCray, Nebraska coach Doc Anderson moved down the sideline and sat on the scorer's table and received another technical. McDermott made three of the four technical free throws and Gibbs hit both of his free throws to put Creighton up 51-45. McDermott followed with a three-point shot to put the Bluejays (7-0) up by nine. Nebraska (4-3) never got closer than seven after that. Antoine Young had 14 points for Creighton and Gibbs finished with 11.

Spencer led Nebraska with 29 points, McCray had 15 and Jorge Brian Diaz added 10.

**MICHIGAN STATE 110, NEBRASKA-OMAHA 68: EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP)** — Raymond Green made a quick recovery from a scary injury, and finished with 23 points and 10 rebounds to lead Michigan State past Nebraska-Omaha 110-68 on Sunday. Green was 10 for 18 from the free-throw line in the streaking Spartans (6-2), including 6-for-8 shooting in the first half when he went down in pain under his basket. He returned to the game just three minutes later wearing a left knee wrap.

Backcourt partner Keith Appling added 13 points, nine rebounds and seven assists in 23 minutes. The Spartans shot 61 percent from the field, including 50 percent on 3-pointers.

Brandon Wood had his second straight strong performance, contributing 20 points and six rebounds, as Michigan State ruled the boards 54-16 and matched the sixth-highest point total in school history.

Mitch Albers had 17 points for the Mavericks (3-6), whose busy weekend began with a win at Northern Illinois Saturday.

**AUGUSTANA 62, MSU-MANKATO 27: SIOUX FALLS** — Shaunteva Astana's jumper with 22 seconds left gave Augustana a three-point lead, and Emily Schulte's block 14 seconds later made it stick as the Vikings held on for a 62-57 victory over Minnesota State in a 78-58 Northern Sun women's basketball win Saturday evening over Southwest Minnesota State at Rice Auditorium in Verne.

The Wildcats remained unbeaten at 8-0 overall and 2-0 in league play while Southwest Minnesota State drops to 1-5 on the season and 0-2 in league play.

**NORTH DAKOTA STATE 84, IUPUI 79: INDIANAPOLIS (AP)** — Taylor Braun scored 30 points on 9-of-11 shooting, helping hot-shooting North Dakota State withstand another IUPUI comeback en route to an 84-79 victory Saturday.

TrayVonn Wright had 16 points, 12 rebounds and four blocked shots for the Bison (7-1, 1-1 Summit), who shot a combined 62 percent (28 of 45) from the field, including 54 percent (6 of 11) on 3-pointers. Mike Fell added 11 points.

Alex Young scored 20 points and Sean Espesold had 14 for the Jaguars (9-2, 0-2) who were coming off a tough 97-93 overtime loss Thursday to South Dakota State. IUPUI rallied from an 18-point second-half deficit in that game to force overtime.
