Sun and Moon

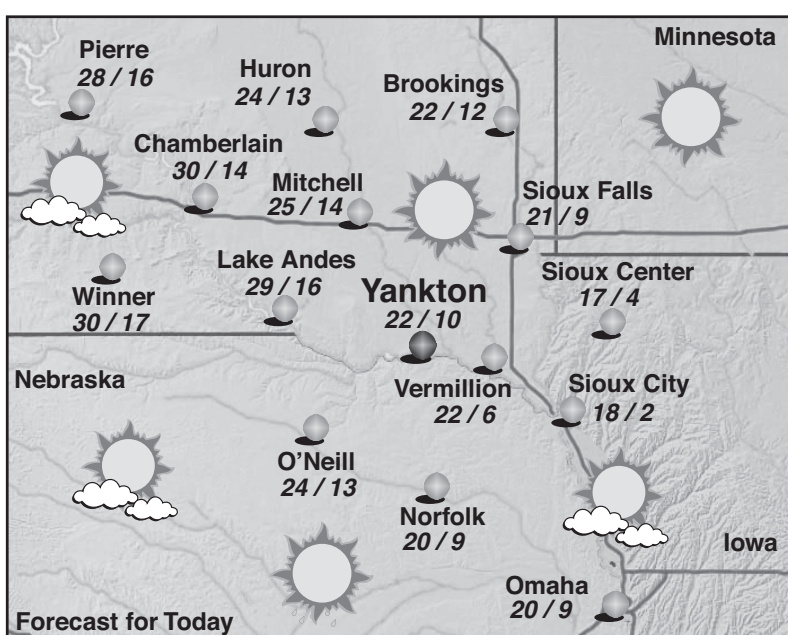
Sun and moon schedule for Yankton, listing sunrise, sunset, moonrise, and moonset times.
