

City To Consider Employees Contract, Commission Raise

The Yankton City Commission will consider its collective bargaining agreement with employees Monday, as well as study whether to give itself a raise.

As part of the two-year agreement with union employees, commissioners will look at awarding a 2 percent raise and a one step increase on the pay plan in 2012. The same will be done for nonunionized workers.

Also Monday, the commissioners will consider raising their compensation from \$233 per month for a commissioner and

\$316 per month for mayor to \$400 and \$550, respectively. Among the other items on the

agenda will be a \$5,000 funding request from the Yankton Convention and Visitors Bureau to be used as seed money for drawing conventions, a hearing regarding a planned \$3.7 million wastewater system improvement project and placing stop signs at intersections around the Menards development. The meeting gets under way

at 7 p.m. in the City of Yankton Meeting Room, located at the Technical Education Center, 1200 W. 21st St.
