City To Consider Employees Contract, Commission Raise

The Yankton City Commission will consider its collective bargaining agreement with employees Monday, as well as study whether to give itself a raise. As part of the two-year agreement with union employees, commissioners will look at awarding a 2 percent raise and a one step increase on the pay plan in 2012. The same will be done for non-unionized workers. Also Monday, the commissioners will consider raising their compensation from \$233 per month for a commissioner and \$316 per month for mayor to \$400 and \$550, respectively. Among the other items on the agenda will be a \$5,000 funding request from the Yankton Convention and Visitors Bureau to be used as seed money for drawing conventions, a hearing regarding a planned \$3.7 million wastewater system improvement project and placing stop signs at intersections around the Menards development. The meeting gets under way at 7 p.m. in the City of Yankton Meeting Room, located at the Technical Education Center, 1200 W. 21st St.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures mostly fell Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for March delivery fell 1 cent to \$5.96 a bushel; March corn fell 6 cents to \$5.9425 a bushel; March oats were unchanged at \$3.02 a bushel; and January soybeans dropped 25.50 cents to \$11.07 a bushel.

Beef and pork futures fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

February live cattle fell 1.15 cent to \$1.1845 a pound; January feeder cattle slipped 0.37 cent to \$1.4210 a pound; while February lean hogs fell 0.83 cent to 87.25 cents a pound.
