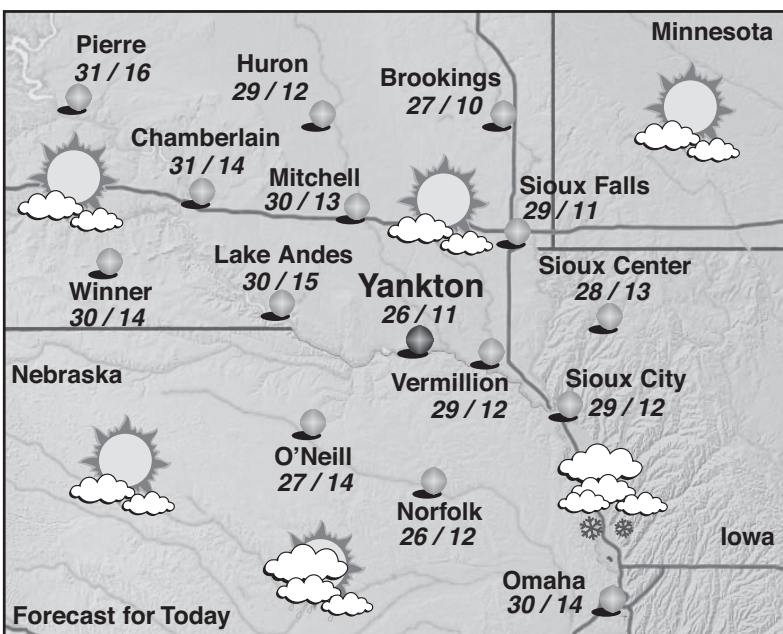

Lake Andes Man Sentenced For Escape

SIoux FALLS — A Lake Andes man charged with escape was sentenced this week in federal court, according to U.S. Attorney Brendan Johnson.

David McGhee, age 30, was sentenced Tuesday to 15 months in custody, to be served consecutively to the sentence he is presently serving. He was sentenced by Chief U.S. District Judge Karen Schreier.

In July 2011, McGhee was serving a sentence with the Bureau of Prisons for the offense of being a felon in possession of a firearm.

On July 16, McGhee absconded from Glory House. The facility reported the escape to the United States Marshal's Service, and McGhee was placed on escape status.

Approximately eight hours after the escape, McGhee was captured by the Sioux Falls Police Department.

McGhee was indicted for escape by a federal grand jury on August 9, 2011. He pled guilty to the indictment on October 5, 2011.

This case was investigated by the Sioux Falls Police Department and the United States Marshal's Service. Assistant U.S. Attorney Thomas Wright prosecuted the case.

McGhee was immediately turned over to the custody of the U.S. Marshal.

Man Convicted Of Sexual Assault, Incest In Cedar County, Neb.

HARTINGTON, Neb. (AP) — A 37-year-old man has been convicted of sex assault and incest in northeast Nebraska's Cedar County.

A news release from the office of Nebraska Attorney General Jon Bruning says the man was found guilty of two counts of sexual assault and two counts of incest.

Sentencing has been set for Feb. 13. The maximum prison penalties for the four felony counts add up to 140 years.

Prosecutors say the man began assaulting the girl when she was 6 years old.

The Associated Press is not using the man's name, to protect the privacy of his victim.
