Natural Resources Conservation Grants Awarded

PIERRE — Twenty grant projects benefitting South Dakota's natural resources were recently approved by the State Conservation Commission. The funds were awarded to 18 conservation districts that applied for funding through the Coordinated Natural Resources Conservation Fund. The Fund is administered by the South Dakota Department of Agriculture (SDDA) on behalf of the State Conservation Commission.

Area conservation districts receiving funding include:

- Bon Homme County Conservation District — \$23,450 for the conservation enhancement project
- Charles Mix County Conservation District — \$8,513 for the technical assistance project
- Douglas County Conservation District — \$12,346 for the tree planting and maintenance project

Funding for the Coordinated Natural Resources Conservation Fund is provided by state law which states that \$500,000 will be deposited into the fund on July 1 of each year. Conservation districts may apply for grant funds at any time. Grant applications are typically reviewed in May and November each year. Grant applications for the May grant round must be received by April 1 and grant applications for the November grant round must be received by Oct. 1. CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures rose Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for March delivery rose 0.25 cent to \$6.22 a bushel; March corn rose 2 cents to \$6.1950 a bushel; March oats rose 0.50 cent to \$3.1125 a bushel; and January soybeans rose 0.75 cent to \$11.63 a bushel.

Beef and pork futures also rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

February live cattle rose 0.87 cent to \$1.2432 a pound; January feeder cattle rose 0.75 cent to \$1.4762 a pound; while February lean hogs rose 1.30 cent to 85.85 cents a pound.
