tablishment of a circle track coming off what is known as the Napa Junction switch. The loading point will have the capability to fill 110 shuttle cars within 10 hours.

The company wants to break ground next year.

There is a ton of value in this location," Winsand said. "It's not just Dakota Plains that is coming to this area. There is huge opportunity at Napa Junction. (BNSF Railway Company) has kind of a stronghold on South Dakota. What this does is open competition to BNSF. We have access to four

other railroads off that short line. 'We've talked to different companies that would also come in. For instance, we have an ethanol plant that is extremely interested," he added. "But somebody has to start the process.'

Dakota Plains wants users to have access to the proposed facility along 435th Avenue by turning west on 306th Street from Highway 81 and then turning south on 435th Avenue. Those approaching from Highway 50 would be able to turn north onto 435th Avenue.

It has been estimated that, as the operation matures in the first eight years, 100-120 trucks could eventually come into the facility on a normal day. During harvest season, that number could balloon to 400-500 trucks.

Because of that heavy truck traffic, the commission believes concrete roads will be needed.

If truck routes are granted from the north and south, Commissioner Mark Johnson has said it will cost in excess of \$10 million to upgrade the roads.

Commissioner Allen Sinclair said Napa Junction provides a

challenge most other facilities of this scale do not have — it is a significant distance from a federal or state highway.

"This is a unique situation," he said. "Maybe the (Dakota Plains) business plan could be rewritten and some money could come out of the millions that this facility is going to generate to pay for this road. We'll need the tax flow out of the property tax just to maintain the roads after good ones are built.

"We'd love to have your facility, but we really are going to look closely at the way this road situation is done," he continued. "We're not going to put the taxpayers out on a limb.

Winsand assured the commission that the company will take a look at putting money into the


"It's a vital organ for us," he said.

After an employee of the South Dakota Department of Agriculture spoke in support of the project on behalf of Secretary Walt Bones, Commissioner Donna Freng said she had a message she wanted taken back to Pierre.

"This county is not against this project," she said. "We want this project here in Yankton County just as much as (Dakota Plains) wants it here. But we don't have the money for these roads, and we're not going to come up with the money out of thin air.

A former state secretary of agriculture once called Yankton County anti-ag, and it is a label the commission has long been conscious of refuting.

As a next step to figuring out the solution to the road issue, Gov. Dennis Daugaard submitted a letter asking that a meeting be set up with his staff, the South Dakota Department of Transportation,
