'Christmas At The Cathedral' Set For S.F.

SIoux FALLS — Christmas at The Cathedral, the nationally acclaimed Christmas celebration, will be performed six times Thursday through Sunday, Dec. 13-16, at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Sioux Falls. Christmas at The Cathedral has sold out all performances for 15 straight years.

This year's production, "Prepare the Way!," shares the Christmas and Advent story from the perspective of Elizabeth and features the return of internationally renowned tenor Scott Piper, the debut of soprano Shelley Jennings and the arrangements of conductor/music director, Dan Goeller.

As he has for the past several years, Dan Goeller has written and arranged much of the music for this year's Christmas at The Cathedral. He will also direct the 32-member orchestra. Guest artists will include the Cathedral of St. Joseph Choir, conducted by Jared Ostermann and actress Jacqueline Pierce-Humke playing the role of Elizabeth.

Children will make a living Nativity scene on stage while Piper and Jennings sing Dan Goeller's composition, "Heaven's Lamb," a duet that depicts Joseph and Mary contemplating the implications of Christ's birth. As has become a tradition, the concerts will culminate with the "Hallelujah Chorus" from Handel's Messiah.

Peter, walking on water: "And Peter went down from the boat, and walked upon the waters, to come to Jesus. But when he saw the wind, he was afraid; and beginning to sink, he cried out, saying, Lord save me."

If you find today's problems producing anxiety and stress, join with me in taking a look at Jesus. Fastening his eyes on Jesus, Peter could walk on water. But when he took his eyes off of Jesus, he sank down into the water and was helpless. Our nation was built upon a foundation of Judean-Christian principles. The founding fathers envisioned a nation of limited power and protection of minorities. This appears to be eroding as larger and larger government develops supporting policies that destroy our families and lead to restriction and even discrimination regarding our liberty ...

Jesus in History (His-Story)

"But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honor, that he by the grace of God should taste death for every man" — Hebrews 2:9.

Looking at Jesus in this passage, we see him facing adversity and securing triumph over evil and death. He lived a life we couldn't live, died on the cross taking our place, and paying a price we couldn't pay, and obtaining a gift for us we could not afford. By inviting him into our hearts we receive a loving God who can make our lives fulfilling with purpose and assurance, no matter how bad things can get. Here is triumph in victory over death and his coronation as King of all kings.

Seventy-one years ago, President Roosevelt declared that this date, Dec. 7, 1941, "would be a date that would live in infamy," after Japan's attack on Pearl Harbor. Today, we can look back at some of the surprising events that followed.

Mitsuo Fucida, the commander of the Japanese bomber squadron that made the attack, was converted to Christianity and became an evangelist. Jacob DeShazer, a bombardier on an Army Air Force raid on Tokyo the following April, was captured by the Japanese in occupied China after the plane crashed.

In a prison camp, he received a Bible that led him to promise God if he ever got home, he would come back to Japan as a missionary to reach the Japanese for Christ. This resulted in Fucida coming to Christ and they became friends. In spite of the evil of war, God performs miracles in people's lives.

Following World War II a falling away came between the allied nations. Atheistic communism Russia began enforcing its program of suppressing captive nations and breaking treaties. Winston Churchill, among others, invoked the term "Iron Curtain" on what he saw rising around the Soviet Union and enslaving its citizens. It came to a point where the "Berlin Wall" was erected preventing East Germans from fleeing to West Germany and freedom. In the years following the Soviet Empire began to weaken and President Reagan publicly challenged Premier Gorbachev to "tear down that wall."

Not only were the communists forced to tear down the wall but on Dec. 25, 1991, the Communist flag came down over the Kremlin in Russia and the free Soviet flag went up! Is it not significant that this happened on the day we celebrate the birthday of Jesus Christ?

Let us take a look at Jesus in the Gospels of Good news.

The Gospel of Matthew sees Jesus as the promised King meeting all the qualifications entitling him to the throne of David, as the

Jewish Messiah to be King of Kings and Lord of Lords to rule over all nations. Luke shows us Jesus as the son of man who is qualified to take our place to bear the punishment for sin on the cross. Mark presents him as the obedient servant of God sent to minister and give his life a ransom for many. In John's Gospel we see Jesus presented as the Word, who became flesh and dwelt among us.

John writes of the event of the transfiguration where he states "and we beheld his glory, the only begotten of the father, full of grace and truth." Grace tells us that God has chosen to offer a relationship with Him to us that give life value. Truth can only be properly defined in the light given from the Law, which also defines evil. Without understanding the meaning of the cross and resurrection, life has no real purpose.

History records that he returned victoriously from the grave. He came back from the dead and was seen by more than 500 witnesses. Scripture records that he ascended into heaven and promises to return with total victory over evil.

Unfortunately, we live in an age of skepticism, where Christianity has become an object of ridicule and even persecution. Along with this comes a depressing philosophy that offers no hope or any assurance of life after death.

Now, Let us look at His Word (The Bible).

I believe that God has, out of love, given us life with freedom to choose. He has left us with the Scriptures, our Bible, which I understand is the most widely circulated book in the world, still be translated into cultures with no written language today. It has survived every attempt to keep people from reading it from the Middle Ages of the past to atheistic communism of today. On the contrary, it continues to spread to every part of the world through modern electronics via cell phone and satellite to bible translators in the jungles.

Candlelight Christmas Concert Set For Yankton's UCC Sunday

Experienced musicians, an array of instruments, words of inspiration, and special lighting effects — all will bring to life a stunning collection of Christmas music, old and new, during the Candlelight Christmas Concert scheduled for 5:30 p.m. this Sunday, Dec. 9, in the Yankton United Church of Christ (Congregational) sanctuary at Fifth & Walnut.

The public is invited to attend and enjoy what the church's choir director, Jennifer Powell, calls "a gift to the community."

The congregation's Adult Choir will be presenting what one member termed "the best set of Christmas anthems I've ever sung in one concert."

Concertgoers will hear everything from the classical — Vivaldi's "Gloria" — to the classic — "Gesu Bambino" (women's chorus and oboist, Sheila Wipf,

Freeman) and "Still, Still, Still" (men's chorus) — to the contemporary by such well-known composers as John Rutter and Pepper Choplin. One anthem will have listeners dancing in their seats, and another, based on the first three verses of the gospel of John, is almost a speech piece.

The choir's music will be supplemented by performances of a brass ensemble made up of professional area instrumentalists. Members of the group — gathered by Ted Powell, Yankton UCC's director of music and organist — are Kevin McLouth, Tyn-dall; Gwen Wenisch, Yankton; Meghan Powell, Gayville; and Todd and Bobbi Carr, Yankton.

Also performing will be the vocal group Mirabile, eight area women who began singing together in 2011, primarily to entertain in nursing

homes and assisted living centers. Members (all of Yankton except where otherwise noted) are Mary Pat Bierle, Kathy Grow, JoAnn Lambert, Celia Miner, Jennifer Powell, Lea Ann Schramm, Linda Stevens and Janine Tramp, Crofton.

For this concert, Mirabile will be singing "Gaudete," one of British composer Howard Goodall's "Enchanted Carols." This arrangement of a 17th-century Christmas song will be accompanied for this performance by special guests Kim Evander, Yankton, viola; Ted Powell, organ; and Kathleen West, Yankton, electronic celesta, as well as Mirabile members playing glockenspiel and handbells.

Four members of the Adult Choir will be sharing seasonal readings as another part of this special

holiday presentation. They are Mary Pat Bierle, Robert Hansen, Jim Reimler and Sylvia Selgestad.

And what about the candlelight? Jennifer Powell said with a laugh, "We are using special lighting to, hopefully, create a feeling of candlelight without being so dimly lit that the choir can't see. We've got professionals working on it!"

Beautiful decorations in the spacious sanctuary will enhance the experience for all those in the area who welcome a chance to celebrate the season with glorious music, words, and setting. Admission is free, though an offering will be gathered.
