recently that he is confident Gustad will be a good fit.

"He's got a lot of fire, and I think he'll help take us to another stage in the organization of the highway department," he stated.

Due to a restructuring of the highway department, the new superintendent will have a more administrative role geared toward activities such as writing grants and drawing up long-term road and bridge plans than in the past.

Gustad said he looks forward to sitting down with the commission and figuring out how the restructuring should take shape. It

is a challenge for which he says he is ready.

"I'm going to have to sit down and look at what we have currently and what has been done in the past (when developing long-term objectives)," Gustad stated. "I'll form my plans from there."

He also hopes to draw upon the many years of experience of his staff. Because he is 27, Gustad expects there will be some skepticism about his abilities.

"I'm not very old, but I feel like I'm bringing a lot to the table," he said. "And with all the experience of those guys out there, I want to listen to their input. I hope to sit down with each and every one of them in the next month or two. I want to get to know them and develop good relationships with them."

Some of the strongest attrib-

utes Gustad feels he brings to the office are communication skills, technical skills and innovation.

"Communication skills are one thing I will shine at," he said. "If I do get a call but miss it, I will call you back. I want to be open and stay in constant communication. A lot of the input is going to come from the public and the workers. I hope to bring their ideas in."

In his free time, Gustad said he enjoys hunting, fishing and spending time with his wife, Andrea, and their three children.

Some people may remember him from his lawn mower racing days. In his early 20s, Gustad won a national championship.

Since then, family has slowed

down the tempo of his racing career, he said.

"A lot of what was so good about racing was meeting new people," Gustad said. "You travel and form friendships. I'm still friends with a lot of them."

During this first year on the job, he said it would be nice if snowfall accumulation is as light as last winter.

"For my sake, I'd like it to stay 40 degrees and then rain," Gustad joked. "We need the moisture, but I could do without the snow."

NASHVILLE — Astronaut Mark Kelly will speak at the 94th annual American Farm Bureau meeting in Nashville, Tenn., on Jan. 13-16, 2013. Kelly is one of Americas most experienced pilots. Navy Captain Kelly has experienced 375 aircraft carrier landings, 39 combat missions and logged 50 days in space. He served as commander of the

Space Shuttle Endeavor's final mission. Kelly is a prostate cancer survivor and is author of "Mousetronaut: A Partially True Story" a children's book released in October.

Kelly is married to Gabrielle Giffords, former member of Congress, who survived an assassination attempt January 2011.
