Gazelles are Optimistic Going into Basketball Season



The Yankton Gazelles basketball team will look to build off a successful season last year, in which they were only a game away from the Girls AA State Tournament.

Yankton lost seven key seniors with seasoned varsity experience.

The Gazelles will have a fairly new look this season, adding practically a whole new roster into the mix.

"We are going to have to be executing our plays to perfection," senior Mikala Hora said. "We don't have as much experience as other teams in the state, so we're going to have to do all the little things right."

In order to get to the state tournament in Rapid City this spring, the Gazelles will have to work harder than before and show up to practice ready to play.

"We have to show up to practice like it's a game," senior Brianna Newman said. "It's going to take a lot of teamwork and leadership, but I think if we do all these things, we will be successful this season."

Seniors Mikala Hora and Kelsey Fitzgerald will be asked to take the role as team leaders, since they have the most experience.

"Just be calm in any situation," Hora said. "Listen to the coaches, but be confident in yourself."

However, due to a lingering knee injury, Hora will have to sit out some time to heal up for the long haul.

Hora hurt her knee during a volleyball match this past fall. "I am starting physical therapy," Hora said. "I also am spending time in the ice bath and E-Stim."

E-Stim is electrical stimulation through the nerves.

For now, Hora cannot do any physical contact due to the pain. She is going to be sidelined for at least two weeks.

"Not one player is going to have to pick up the slack," head coach Doug Pesicka said. "Everyone's going to have to



At Huron, Thomas Kruse and Casey Skillingstad won their respective divisions with pins. Mason Strahl was awarded a victory with a 4-1 decision.


The Bucks' Yankton Invitational was held on Dec. 8, though results were unavailable at press time.
