Glenn, at 6-foot-3, 225 pounds, recorded 90 total tackles and 10.5 sacks as a senior for state champion Windsor. He also had offers from Northern Colorado and South Dakota State.

Kyle Staples, an inside linebacker from Fresno City Community College in Fresno, Calif., will transfer to USD. In 2011, he recorded 31 tackles, two for loss. No stats could be found for this past season, when Fresno lost in the State Center Bowl — at the junior college level.
