Gurney

brings tourists to our area, and they really soak it up. It's nice to preserve that history for our use and for future generations.'

In a State Historical Society news release, the Gurney district is listed on the National Register for its history in commerce and entertainment, for the multi-generational contributions made by Gurney family members and for the buildings with a period of significance from 1907-42.

"The Gurney family represented three generations pushing the company to help develop successful South Dakota horticulture, to diversify and use innovative marketing techniques, to engage with community and political issues, and to capitalize on the potential of early radio," the news release said. Nelson hopes the Gurney District

designation encourages other property owners to become part of a historic district or to take advantage if part of a current district.

"It's more than just the nostalgia or the prestige of having your name on the national registry," she said. "It's important to remember or know there are some nice benefits with being on the national registry. I hope it continues to preserve our heritage.'

Buildings, sites, structures and objects at least 50 years old possessing historical significance may qualify for the National Register, according to the State Historical Society. Properties must also maintain their historic location, design, materials and association.

Listing on the National Register does not place any limitations on private property owners by the federal government, according to the State Historical

Historic sites are frequently renovated for modern uses, Nelson said.
"You look at the East Coast and Europe, and they do this all the time," she said. "You take historic structures that are built very well and find new uses for them. It's really neat to see some of the things that people have done all across the globe with historic buildings."

Lowrie noted the tremendous potential for such restoration.

"There are a lot of buildings in Yankton located in historic districts," he said. "They could take advantage of (the national registry). The more, the merrier.'
