## Oil Pipeline Walker Reaches SE Nebraska

MCCOOL JUNCTION, Neb. (AP) — A New York native who's been walking the proposed route of the Keystone XL pipeline has reached southeast Nebraska on his journey from Canada to the Gulf Coast of Texas.

Ken Ilgunas, of Niagara Falls, N.Y., told the *Lincoln Journal Star* as he walked near McCool Junction this week that he's been averaging 15-20 miles a day, burdened by his backpack, waterproof tent and, occasionally, by wary receptions.

Ilgunas says he's concerned about climate change and figured that his 1,700-mile journey would help him understand the issue better. He also is concerned about the environmental impact the tar sands extraction process will have near Hardisty in the province of Alberta.

The 29-year-old began his trip in September and hopes to finish in February.

# Mt. Rushmore To Be Featured On New Quarter

ST. LOUIS — Forget which state Mount Rushmore is in? Look at your change.

The famous mountain-side carving with the faces of Thomas Jefferson, George Washington, Abraham Lincoln and Theodore Roosevelt is internationally known, but one many people just can't quite place, geographically speaking.

Starting next fall, they'll get a little help when the U.S. Mint releases a new America the Beautiful quarter for South Dakota that depicts the famous landmark.

"People do recognize Mount Rushmore as an icon, the shrine of democracy. But having the words South Dakota right next to it, I think that's fantastic," said Maureen McGee-Ballinger, chief of interpretation and education at Mount Rushmore National Memorial.

The quarter will feature two workers putting the final touches on Washington and Jefferson. Washington also will appear where he typically does, on the heads side of the coin.

"We are excited the carving of Mount Rushmore was selected to be honored as a significant site in the state of South Dakota as well as an important National Park Service site," Superintendent Cheryl Schreier said in a statement.

This is the second time the famous mountain carving will grace the 25-cent piece. South Dakota's state quarter, released in 2006, featured a completed carving of Mount Rushmore.

The new design is significantly different, McGee-Ballinger said.

"In 2006, there was the full view of the sculpture. Right above that, there was a rink-necked pheasant," she said. "This particular design focuses on just two faces — Jefferson and

Washington — and doesn't so much focus on the sculpture but the workers, hanging over the side of the cliff."

McGee-Ballinger said the design pays homage to a wide variety of workers who had a part in the 14-year creation of the magnificent sculpture, constructed from 1927 to 1941.

Mount Rushmore will be the 20th quarter released in the America the Beautiful quarter series. Each state, territory and the District of Columbia will ultimately have a design released honoring national parks and nationally significant sites.

The other quarters to be released next year will depict Great Basin National Park in Nevada, Perry's Victory and International Peace Memorial in Ohio, Fort McHenry National Monument and Historic Shrine in Maryland and White Mountain national Forest in New Hampshire.

## Hearings To Resentence Juvenile Lifers On Hold

LINCOLN, Neb. — A lawsuit filed by 14 Nebraska prison inmates serving life for crimes they committed as juveniles will now take months, if not years, to wend through the courts.

The lawsuit filed Nov. 29 in Douglas County seeks to stop the Nebraska pardons board from resentencing the inmates, in the wake of a U.S. Supreme Court ruling that invalidated life-without-parole prison terms for juveniles. A lawyer for the prisoners has said the pardons board wants to impose new sentences that would effectively keep the offenders in prison for the rest of their lives.

A day after the lawsuit was filed, a Douglas County judge issued an order to temporarily halt the early December hearings until the case was resolved. The pardons board asked the state Supreme Court to step in immediately and the hearings were canceled.

But the court declined to intervene right away, choosing instead to have state attorneys and the inmates' lawyer argue the case in lower courts, according to a ruling released Thursday.

The pardons board is made up of Nebraska Gov. Dave Heineman, Attorney

General Jon Bruning and Secretary of State John Gale.

In a statement Thursday, Bruning called on lawmakers to address the issue when they convene next year. Advocates for the inmates have said they're worried that Bruning will propose new sentencing laws in his annual legislative package, laws that would violate the spirit of the U.S. Supreme Court's ruling.

Bruning spokeswoman Shannon Kingery refused Friday to elaborate on the attorney general's statement, saying he would introduce a series of bills on Jan. 9.

Douglas County Public Defender Tom Riley argued that the Pardons Board does not have jurisdiction to commute the sentences, because the inmates do not have pending requests for them to do so.

The lawsuit also argues that the U.S. Supreme Court ruling invalidates the prisoners' sentences, meaning the Pardons Board has no constitutionally valid sentences to commute.

A phone message left Friday with Riley's office was not immediately returned.

In July, Iowa Gov. Terry Branstad commuted the life-without-parole sentences of 38 convicted killers. Branstad's order made the inmates eligible for parole, but only after they had served 60 years in prison.

Man Sentenced For Bank Robberies

ST. LOUIS, Mo. (AP) — A South Dakota man has been sentenced to 10 years in federal prison for robbing banks in Iowa and Nebraska.

Karlis Baisden of Vermillion received the prison term earlier this week in Sioux City. He's also been ordered to pay \$19,000 in restitution.

The 25-year-old pleaded guilty last year to an attempted bank robbery in Lawton, Iowa, and robbing a bank in Fordyce, Neb.

Baisden was arrested in April 2011 for his connection to the Lawton bank robbery. Officials later seized handwritten letters from Baisden's home where he admitted to robbing the bank in Fordyce in December 2010. The letters also included his plans to rob the Lawton bank.

Slight Rise In S.D. Highway Fatalities

ST. LOUIS, Mo. (AP) — The state Department of Public Safety says highway fatalities in South Dakota are up slightly this year after a 20 percent drop in 2011.

Department spokesman Terry Woster tells the *Argus Leader* that 125 people have died in automobile accidents in the state so far this year.

National Highway Traffic Safety Administration statistics show that 111 people in South Dakota died in highway crashes in 2011, compared with 140 in 2010.

Highway Safety director Lee Axdahl says despite this year's slight uptick, the numbers reflect how far the state has come with highway safety.

Axdahl says the department needs to continue to work to bring those numbers down. Deaths from motorcycle crashes were cut in half, and state surveys show that about three-quarters of South Dakotans are buckling up.

Man Arrested In 20-Year Assault Case

BANGOR, Maine (AP) — A Nebraska man wanted in Maine for nearly 20 years on charges of gross sexual assault is being held on \$50,000 bail.

Sixty-three-year-old Clarence Cote of Nehama, Neb., pleaded not guilty to the charges in Penobscot County court on Friday. He was arrested in mid-September after being indicted by a grand jury.

The *Bangor Daily News* reports the victim, who is now 30, reported the abuse to police in 1994. Prosecutors say Cote left the state when he learned that he was being investigated.

Injured S.D. Trooper Leaves Hospital

ST. LOUIS, Mo. (AP) — A South Dakota trooper who was critically injured after an October police chase in Sioux Falls has left the hospital months earlier than expected.

It's an early Christmas gift for the family of Trooper Andrew Steen, who left Sanford Hospital on Friday amid the cheers of more than a hundred supporters.

The *Argus Leader* reports that he left the hospital wearing his Highway Patrol uniform and using crutches.

Steen underwent two surgeries to remove part of his skull to relieve pressure on his brain, and then to replace it. He'd been hit by a car while trying to pull over 28-year-old Rachel Coleman for erratic driving. Coleman was shot at least three times by Steen and Lincoln County deputies before she was arrested. She is to stand trial in March.

Rosebud Hospital Is Recognized

ROSEBUD (AP) — The Indian Health Service hospital on the Rosebud Indian Reservation has been named the first baby-friendly hospital in South Dakota.

The hospital is also the first IHS hospital to earn the designation, which promotes breastfeeding.

The World Health Organization and the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund administer the baby-friendly initiative. Hospitals that achieve the status are committed to promoting and protecting breastfeeding at all stages.
