A senior forward from Madison, Fiegen earned his first career award after a doubledouble performance that led the Jackrabbits past Montana and snapped the Grizzlies' 15game home court win streak, the eighth-longest in NCAA Division I. His two decisive free throws with 8.9 seconds remaining in the second overtime propelled SDSU to the 68-67 victory.
