2 Killed In Accidents In Slick Conditions Near Vermillion

Two people were killed Tuesday in separate accidents that occurred near Vermillion Tuesday, Dec. 18, due to icy conditions.

An Iowa woman died in a one-vehicle crash on Interstate 29 about 12 miles south of Beresford on Tuesday.

Tonya Marie Anderson, 38, of Akron, Iowa, was driving north in a 2004 Chevrolet Colorado when the vehicle went out of control. The roadway was slippery from freezing drizzle. The vehicle entered the median and rolled.

Anderson, who was not wearing a seatbelt, was thrown from the vehicle and received fatal injuries.

No further information is immediately available. The South Dakota Highway Patrol is investigating.

Corps To Increase Gavins Point Releases

OMAHA, Neb. — The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Missouri River Basin Water Management Division plans to step up Gavins Point dam releases by 4,000 cubic feet per second this week in response to colder temperatures moving into the region.

Releases will be increased from 14,000 cfs to 16,000 cfs today (Wednesday) and to 18,000 cfs on Thursday, Dec. 20.

The Corps will monitor the situation closely and make additional adjustments if necessary to maintain intakes along the lower river.

It is anticipated that releases from Gavins Point will be maintained at 18,000 cfs until early January.

semi. White then allegedly got behind the wheel of a red farm tractor and proceeded to ram outbuildings, a vehicle and several fuel tanks on the property. He then allegedly drove the tractor across a field to another farm house, where he damaged outbuildings on the property.

According to police reports, White allegedly attempted to run into a Pierce County sheriff's unit, before using the tractor to ram a Nebraska State Patrol unit responding to the scene.

Trooper Dain Hicks, 41, Troop B-

Columbus, who was in a second unit, fired at the tractor, striking the suspect. White then gave himself up and was taken into custody.

Trooper Brian Detlefsen, 34, Troop B-Norfolk, suffered a cut to his head and bruising when his patrol car was rammed by the suspect.

Detlefsen was treated and released from the Creighton hospital.

White was transported to the Plainview hospital and then flown by medical helicopter to Mercy Medical Center in Sioux City, Iowa, where he is being treated for a non-life threatening gunshot wound to his right side.

Upon his release from the hospital, White will be charged with assault on an officer and held in the Woodbury County, Iowa, jail pending extradition.
