2 Killed In Accidents In Slick **Conditions Near Vermillion**

Two people were killed Tuesday in separate accidents that occurred near Vermillion Tuesday, Dec. 18, due to icy conditions.

Ấn Iowa woman died in a one-vehicle crash on Interstate 29 about 12 miles south of Beresford on Tuesday. Tonya Marie Anderson, 38, of

Akron, Iowa, was driving north in a 2004 Chevrolet Colorado when the vehicle went out of control. The roadway was slippery from freezing dian and rolled.

Anderson, who was not wearing a seatbelt, was thrown from the vehicle and received fatal injuries.

Corps To Increase Gavins Point Releases

OMAHA, Neb. — The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Missouri River Basin Water Management Division plans to step up Gavins Point dam releases by 4,000 cubic feet per second this week in response to colder temperatures moving into the region.

Releases will be increased from 14,000 cfs to 16,000 cfs today (Wednesday) and to 18,000 cfs on Thursday, Dec. 20.

The Corps will monitor the situation closely and make additional adjustments if necessary to maintain intakes along the lower river. It is anticipatef that releases from Gavins Point will be maintained
