



Hunhoff Named New Wyoming NG Commander

CHEYENNE, Wyo. — Maj. Dean Hunhoff of Yankton has assumed command of the Wyoming Army National Guard's Recruiting and Retention Battalion.

He assumed command Dec. 17 at the Joint Forces Readiness Center in Cheyenne.

Hunhoff took command from Lt. Col. Joseph Huss of Laramie. "This is the greatest agency to work for, and I look forward to taking command," Hunhoff said. "We have some challenges, but I look forward to facing them head on."

He previously served as the mobilization readiness officer for the Wyoming Army National Guard. He has been a member of the military for more than 28 years, with 20 years of service in the Wyoming Army National Guard.

Hunhoff and his wife, Gladys, live in Cheyenne, where they both work full-time for the Wyoming National Guard.

The Recruiting and Retention Battalion oversees the recruiting of civilians and those individuals with prior service into the Wyoming Army National Guard. The command is in charge of the Recruit Sustainment Program, which prepares new recruits for basic and advanced training.

The battalion also supports the ROTC program at the University of Wyoming and provides the instructors for the ROTC program at Laramie County Community College.


