

 It is estimated that considerably more than three-quarters of a million dollars were spent in Yankton county for improvements during the year 1937, ending today, not counting funds expended for labor under WPA. but including some of the work on structures on the new routing of state highway No. 50 from Yankton to Gayville which was started in 1936 but was not completed until after the first of the current year.

· In the following statement handed to the press today, Ernest A. Crockett, Yankton attorney and mayor of the city, announced his candidacy as a republican candidate for nomination as congressional candidate from the first district at the May primaries.

50 YEARS AGO

Monday, December 31, 1962 · A grain and stock truck broke through the floor of the Wollman bridge four miles north and 2 1/2 miles west of Menno. The back end went down first. leaving the truck standing on its back end almost straight up and down in the James river.

· The last of the weekly aerial waterfowl censuses along the Missouri river has been completed. The survey showed there are abnormally high numbers of geese along the river.


