SIoux FALLS — All veterans are invited to a Healthy Living Fair at the Sioux Falls VA Medical Center on Friday, Jan. 11, running from 7 a.m.-4 p.m. Veterans (both those who use and those who do not use VA services) and their families are encouraged to attend.

VA staff will be on hand to help Veterans be more involved in their health care, manage stress, eat wisely, be physically active, and

Dellinger said Eisenbraun & Associates has been hired to do platting and engineering of the 24 acres owned by YAPG at the southwest corner of Alumax Road and Bill Baggs Road that will serve as the site for the new structure. He expects development of the property and construction of the building will have a price tag of approxi-

mately \$1 million.

The city and Yankton County have scheduled Bill Baggs Road to be reconstructed and striped as a three-lane street in 2013. Between that and other infrastructure improvements planned in the area, Dellinger said it is a good time to develop the site.

Construction of the spec building will likely begin in the spring, he added.

Dellinger was hesitant to predict the economic climate of 2013.

"It's not that I think next year is going to be great for business expansion," he said. "But next

year sets us up for the couple of years beyond that. In addition to fueling growth, there will probably be a number of visitors who will come to see the building and realize it isn't the building they need. We can still use those cases as marketing opportunities for the community."

While YAPG has focused most of its energies on industrial spec buildings, Dellinger said discussions are under way to determine if that scope should be expanded.

"Could we develop office space or retail space in the future?" he asked. "We're asking

those questions as a developer of Yankton and what will best grow the economy.

"With the exception of one or two facilities, we lack ready-to-go floor space for industry, commercial office and retail," Dellinger continued. "We're a tight market. We need more ready-to-go space in all commercial sectors to be competitive and help companies capitalize."

silver or bronze."

Hanson bought the car 10 years ago after an individual approached him at a Riverboat Days car show, telling him about

a car he had for sale that was a different color than the Sherwood green Buick.

"It took me years to get him to sell me this one," Hanson said. "It's the most collectible kind of this car because it's a valuable stage 1."

Hanson's 1970 Buick was originally sold brand new in 1982 in Alabama for \$4,157.86. The car was then brought to Sioux City,

Iowa, where Hanson purchased the car to begin restoration.

Hanson said he knew when he bought the car, it would take years to fully restore it, especially since it didn't even run. He ended up replacing everything, including the seats, and six years later, it is now a rare collectible.

"I knew when I bought it I was going to completely restore it," he said. "It was in rough shape

when I bought it, so I slowly started accumulating the parts for it, which took a while because it's a rare collectible. I didn't want to only do it halfway — I wanted it to be completely restored."
