BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures mostly fell Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for March delivery fell 22 cents to \$8.6350 a bushel; March corn fell 6 cents to \$7.5275 a bushel; March oats rose 0.25 cent to \$3.7875 a bushel; while January soybeans fell 9.25 cents to \$14.3875 a bushel.

Beef and pork futures fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

February live cattle fell 1.70 cent to \$1.3040 a pound; January feeder cattle fell 1.13 cent to \$1.4562 a pound; while February lean hogs fell 0.20 cent to 86.92 cents a pound.

Wednesday, December 1, 1937

- An organized campaign to obtain signatures of the citizens of Yankton and vicinity to petitions which call upon congress to keep America out of war is to be launched here immediately under the direction of Ernest Bowyer Post, Veterans of Foreign Wars, as part of a nation-wide campaign to get the country signed up.
- In a proclamation to the state, Governor Leslie Jensen has joined tuberculosis workers in an appeal for co-operation in the Christmas Seal Campaign.

50 YEARS AGO

Saturday, December 1, 1962

- Dan Stuelpnagel was appointed by Gov. Archie Gubbrud Friday afternoon as Yankton county representative in the state House of Representatives, to take the place of Bill Johnson, who resigned recently.
- After a slow first quarter the Meckling Panthers found the range and

coasted to a 55 to 47 win over the Gayville Orioles here (Gayville) last night. It was a Tri-Valley conference tilt.

25 YEARS AGO

Tuesday, December 1, 1987

- An estimated \$8 million in tickets were sold in the South Dakota Lottery's first game, which ended Sunday. By Wednesday night, the number of winning tickets submitted to claim prizes indicated that people had spent \$7.75 million on Match 3, the scratch-and match game that kicked off the state lottery Sept 30.
- To say the Yankton Gazelles are peaking at the right moment may be a bit of understatement. The top-rated Gazelles demolished Sioux Falls Lincoln 62-36 in the first round of the District 2AA tournament Monday night in the Sioux Falls arena, advancing to tonight's championship game where they will meet Sioux Falls O'Gorman tonight.
